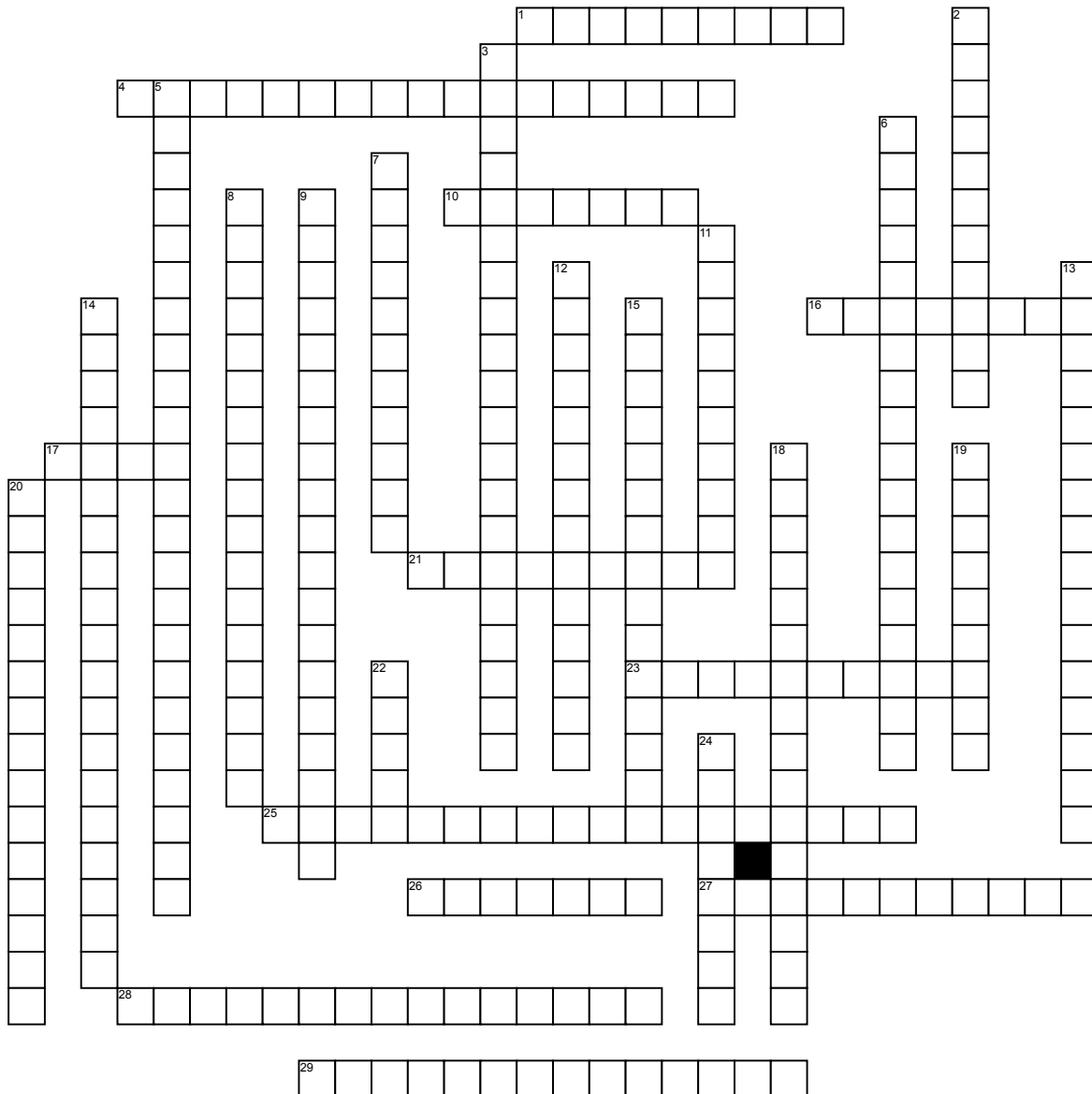

2. a long list of particulars designed to give overwhelming support to a claim
3. assuming that what is true of the part is automatically true of the whole
5. a sign relationship from norm or social conversation
6. probative, sometimes confrontational way to stimulate the audience to support the rhetors position
7. a claim that, on its face, is unrelated to the supporting material
8. assuming that what is true of the whole is automatically true of the part
