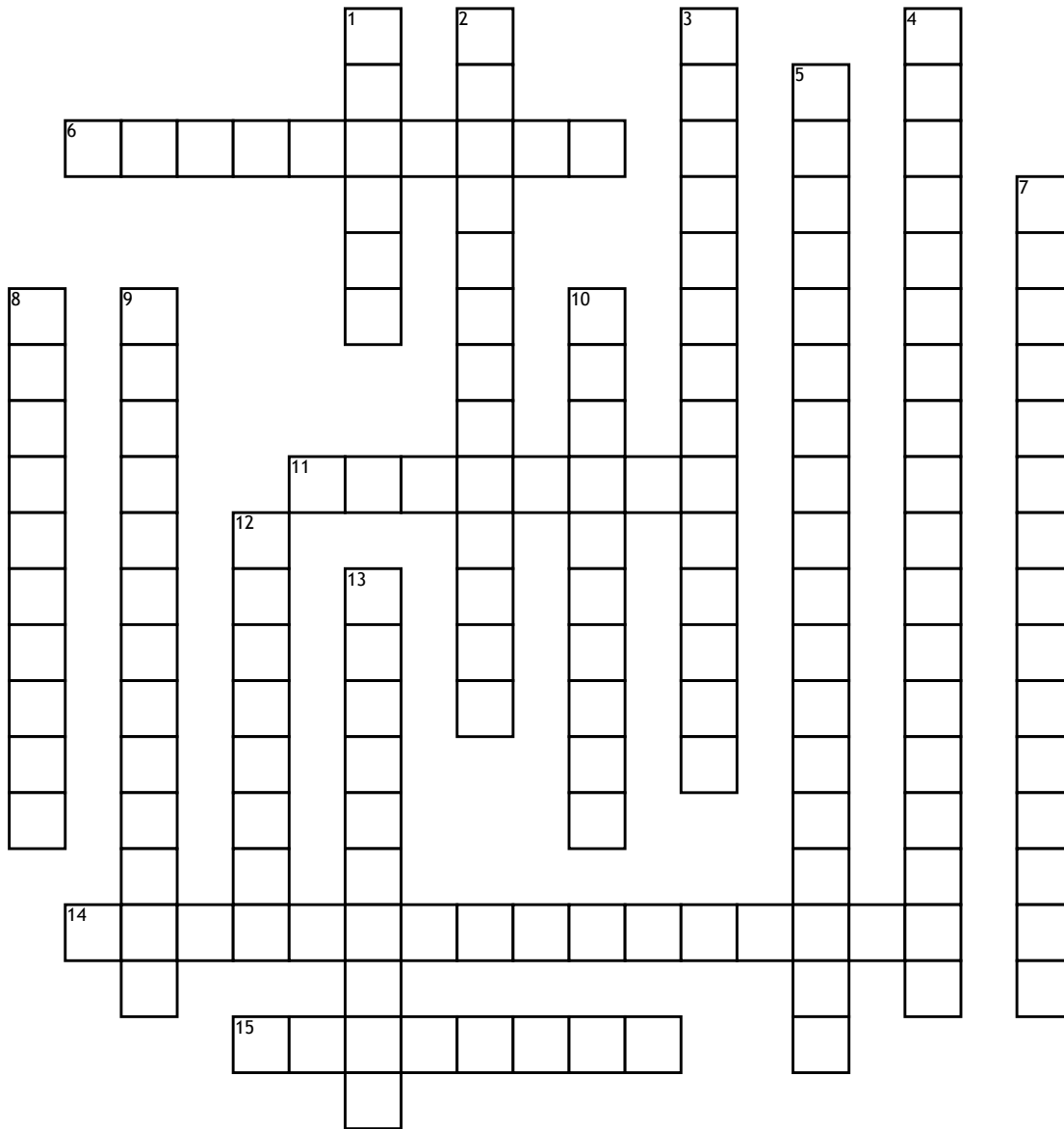

**6.** Combining research results to form a new conclusion based on what you have read.

**11.** To add notes giving an explanation or comment.

**14.** The act of inquiring or of seeking information by questioning. A guide for your research.

**15.** The process of gathering facts and evidence about a topic.

**1.** A statement that summarizes the central idea of the paper and that can be defended by facts and evidence

**2.** A direct or firsthand account about an event, object, person, or work of art.

**3.** A list of sources referred to in the paper that is included on the last page of your research.

**4.** Starting with a general claim then supporting it with specific evidence.

**5.** Starting with specific evidence then coming to a general conclusion or claim.

**7.** Information that was created after the event occurred by someone who did not experience or participate in the event.

**8.** A group of words taken from a text or speech and repeated by someone other than the original author or speaker.

**9.** An organized essay presenting the results of an investigation and reasoning that support a thesis.

**10.** A statement of content in a passage rewritten in your own words.

**12.** A structured set of data held in a computer that is accessible in various ways.

**13.** Failure to give credit to the appropriate sources for borrowed ideas.
