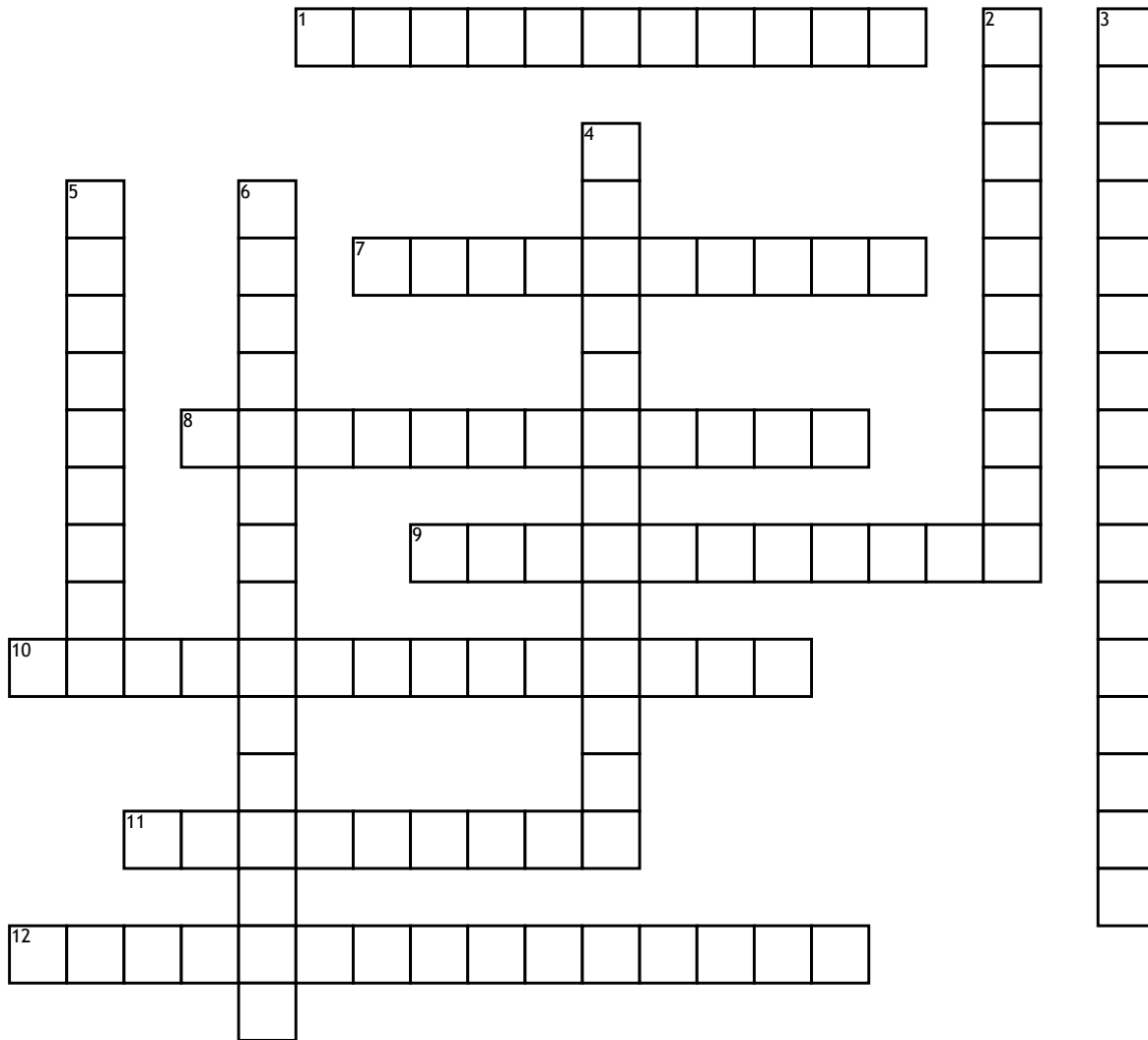

2. Restating an author's idea in different words, often to share information by making the meaning clear to readers.

3. The exact words that a news source uses in giving information.

4. Materials created by people who witnessed or took part in the event they supply information about.
