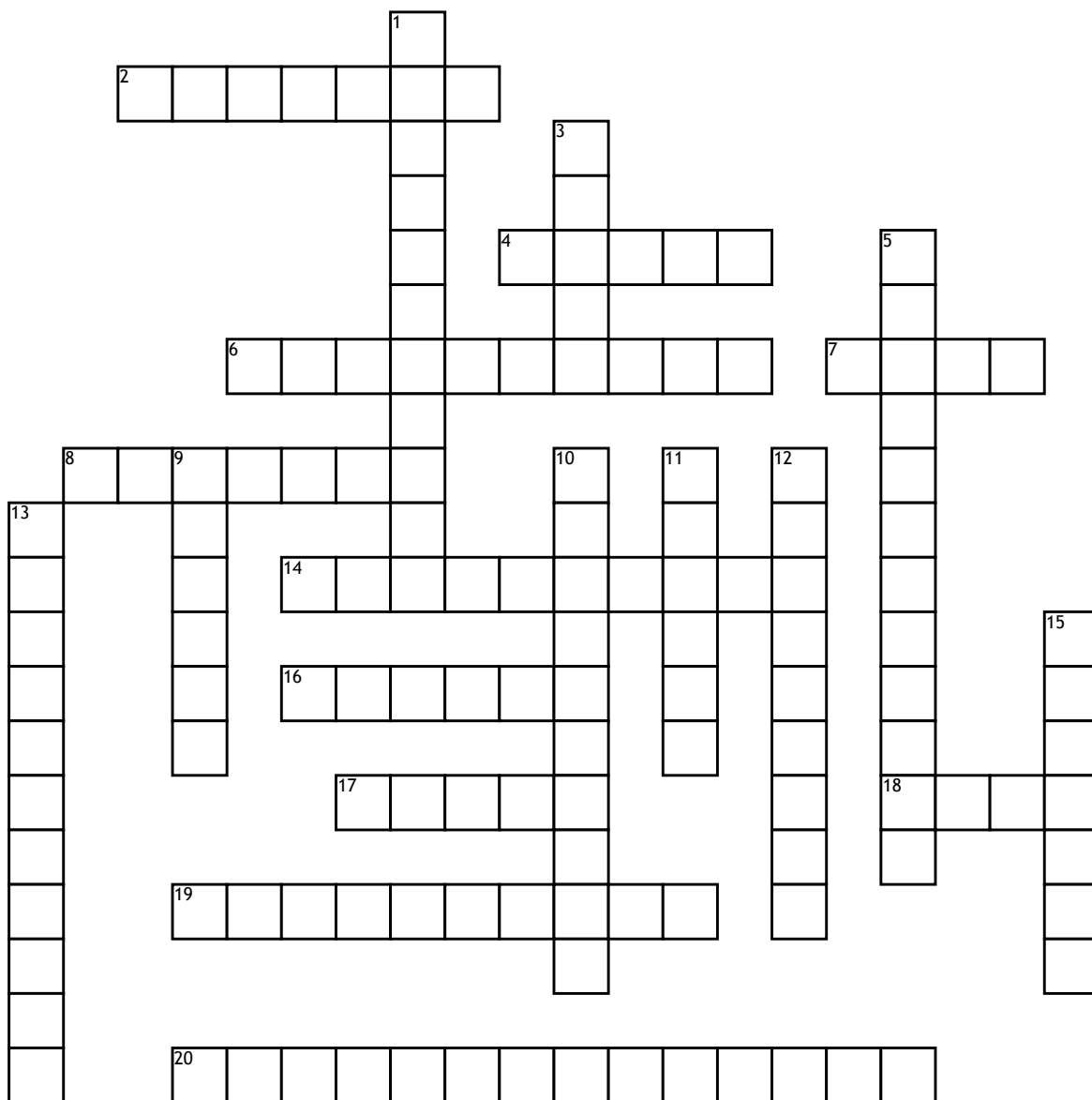


Roads and Bridges
