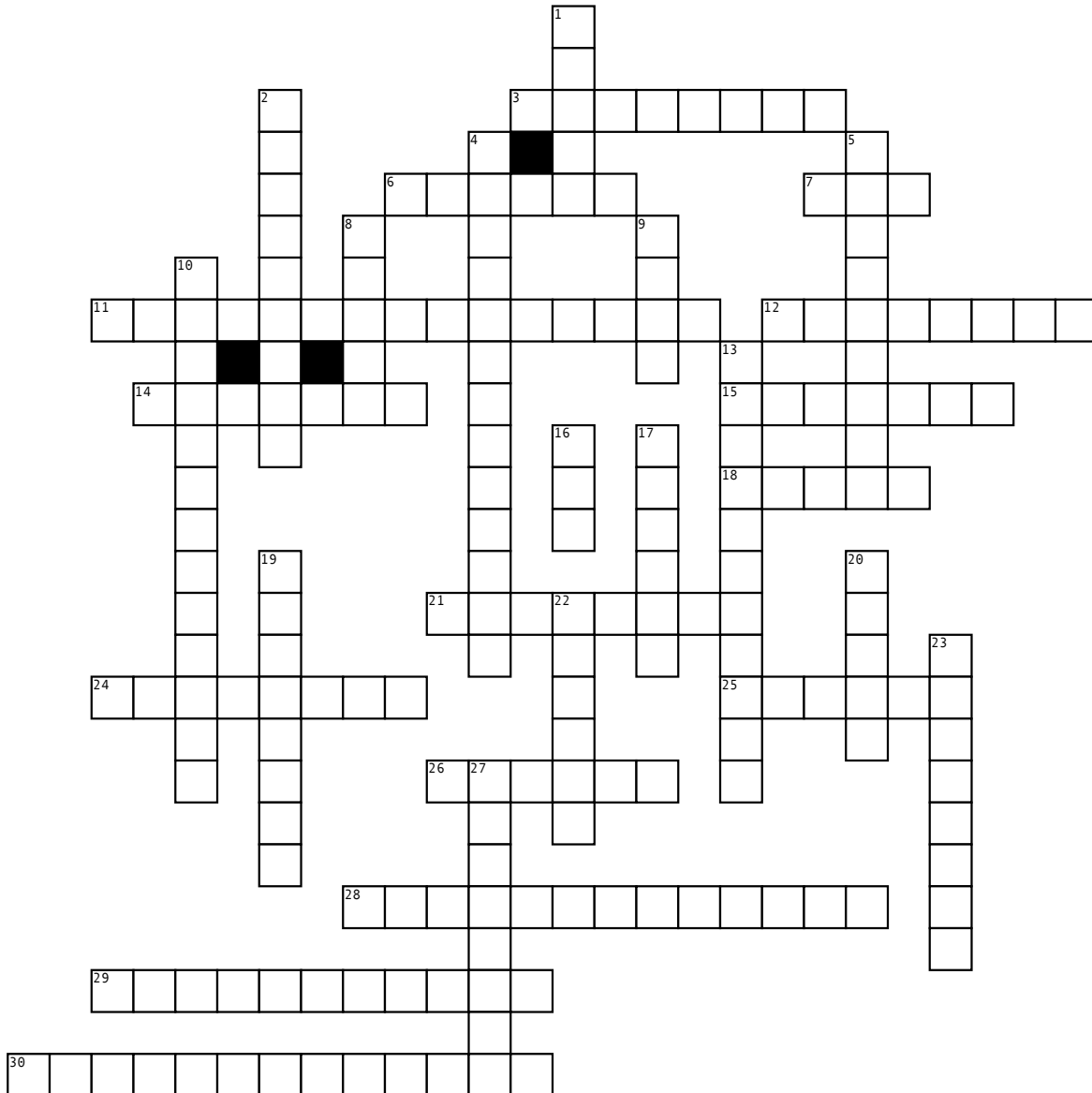


Romeo and Juliet

- 2. A long speech given alone on stage
- 4. A minor character who doesn't change much during the play/story

- 10. Romeo's adviser; helps Romeo and Juliet
- 13. Not favored by the stars; unlucky

- 17. Juliet's short-tempered cousin; Romeo kills him
- 19. "But, soft! What light through yonder window breaks? It is the east, and Juliet is the sun."
