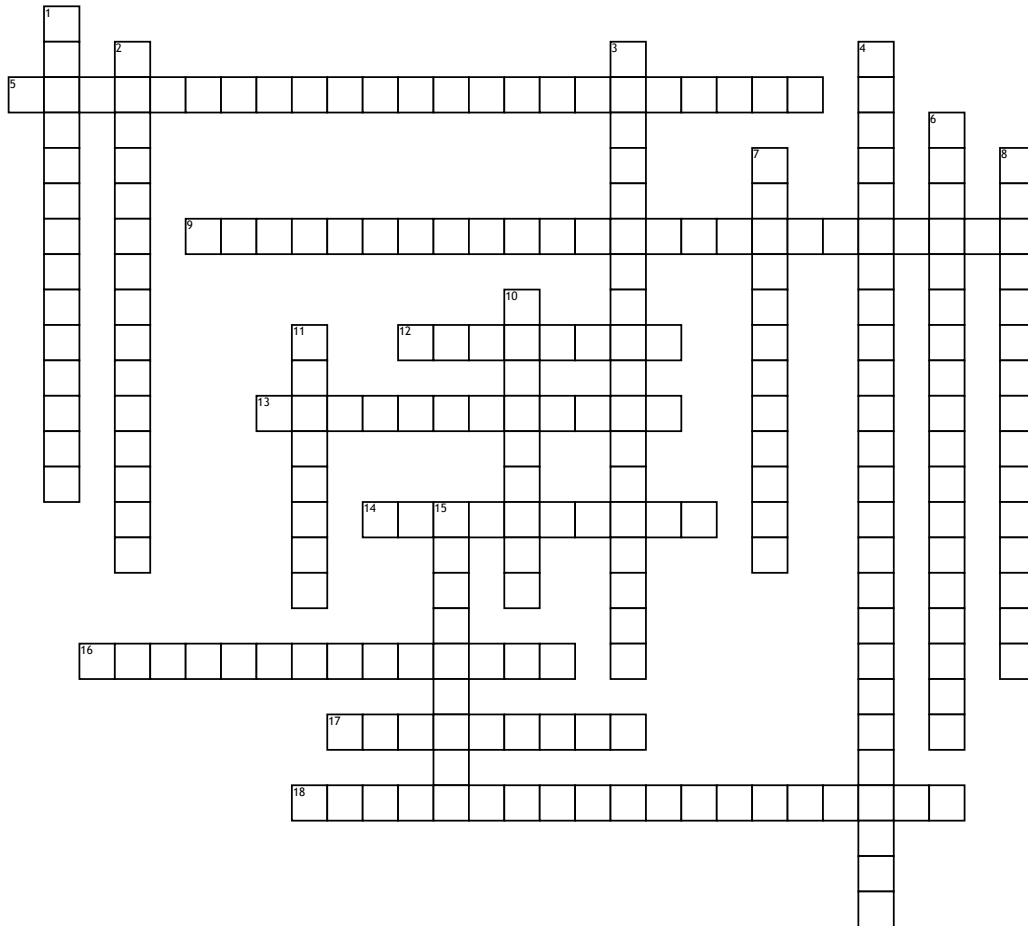


SSH3 Events, Terms, and People

- 5. America's 1st written Constitution. Had many limitations to the functioning of the government.
- 9. Meeting took place in Philadelphia to revise the original Articles of Confederation. From May to September 1787.
- 12. Wanted to be independent from Great Britain. Also known as Whigs.
- 13. The youngest of the GA signers of the Declaration of Independence.
- 14. GA signer of the U.S. Constitution. Was also a judge and legislator of GA and New York.
- 16. Killed in a duel. GA signer of Declaration of Independence.

17. Loyal to Great Britain. Also known as Tories.

18. Small Revolutionary war battle. Elijah Clarke led patriot forces to victory.

- 1. 1st President of the University of Georgia. GA signer of the U.S. Constitution.
- 2. 2nd bloodiest battle of the Revolutionary War. Failed attempt to recapture Savannah.
- 3. Royal proclamation that forbade English colonists from settling west of the Appalachian Mountains. This was issued by King George.
- 4. 3-part document that discusses the natural rights and explains the wrongs committed by King George.

6. A war between England, France, and their Native American allies for control over North America.

7. A written document that outlines a country's government.

8. A compromise made between the large and small states during the Constitutional Convention. Allowed for a 2 house legislator. Senators for each state would be equal. The members of the House of Representatives would be base on the state's population.

10. A sizable sheet of paper printed on one side. This is often used for propaganda.

11. The beginning of a document. Specifically the Declaration of Independence.

15. Built churches. GA signer of Declaration of Independence and governor.
