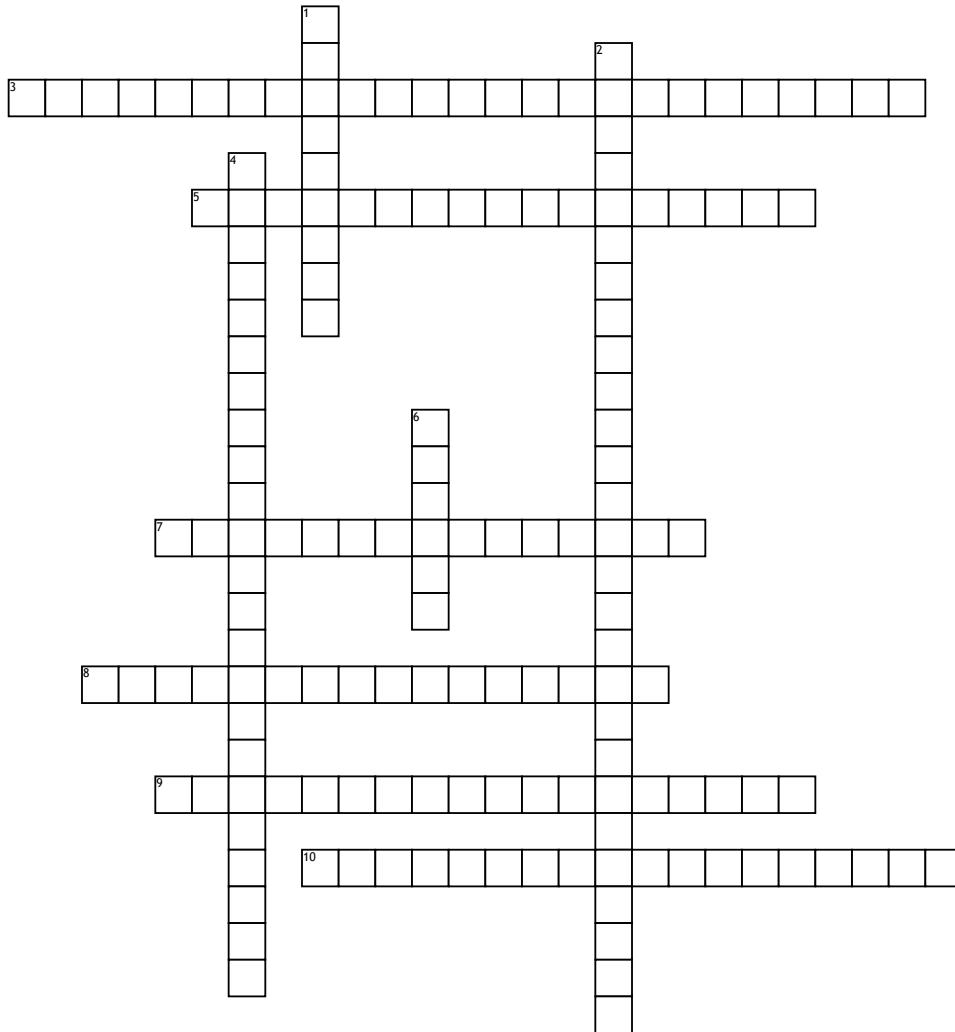

- 3. They were the ones who were not afraid. They knew instinctively that talk and politics alone would not bring an end to British tyranny.
- 5. also known as the Treaty of 1763, was signed on 10 February 1763 by the kingdoms of Great Britain, France and Spain, with Portugal in agreement
- 7. punitive laws passed by the British Parliament in 1774 after the Boston Tea Party.
- 8. the second-longest river and chief river of the second-largest drainage system on the North American continent, second only to the Hudson Bay drainage system.
- 9. It forbade all settlement west of a line drawn along the Appalachian Mountains, which was delineated as an Indian Reserve.

- 10. This war pitted the colonies of British America against those of New France, each side supported by military units from the parent country and by American Indian allies

- 1. an Act of the Parliament of Great Britain which imposed a direct tax on the British colonies
- 2. were shadow governments organized by the Patriot leaders of the Thirteen Colonies on the eve of the American Revolution.

- 6. a political and mercantile protest by the Sons of Liberty in Boston, Massachusetts, on December 16, 1773.
