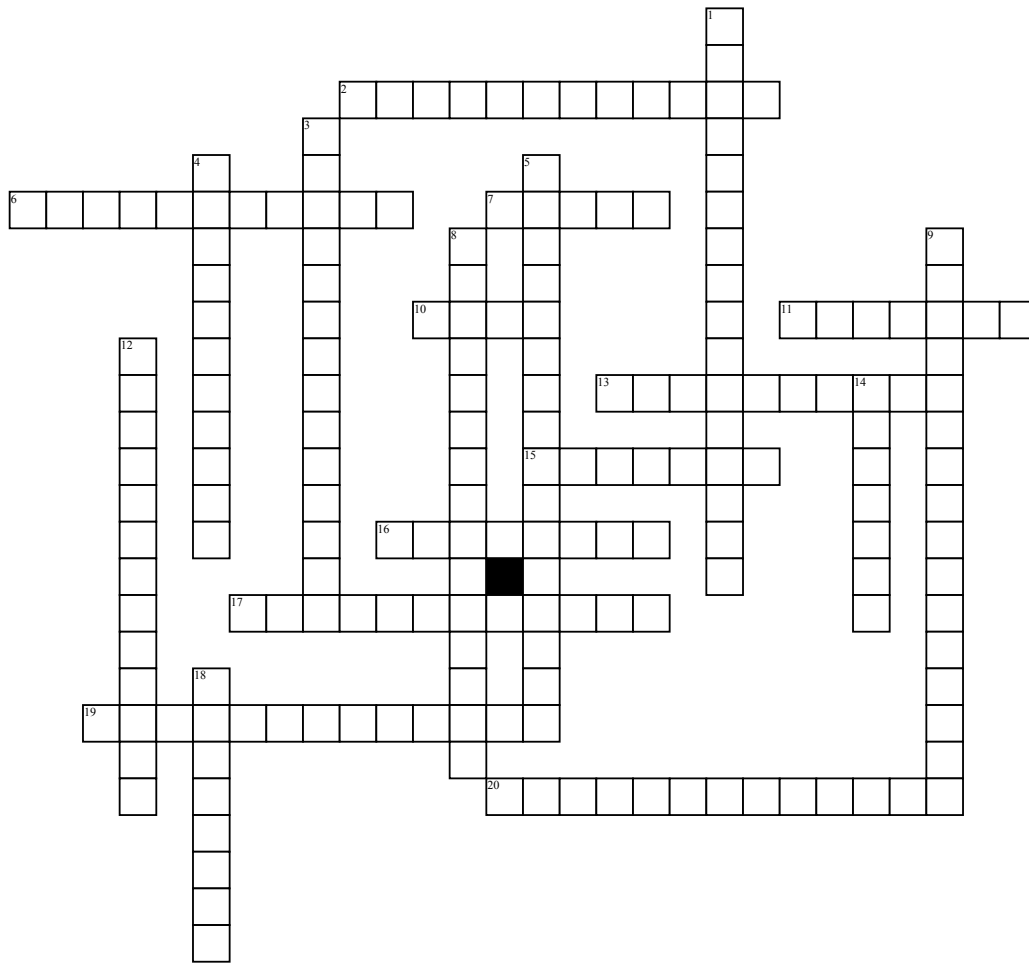


Second Battle of Bull Run
