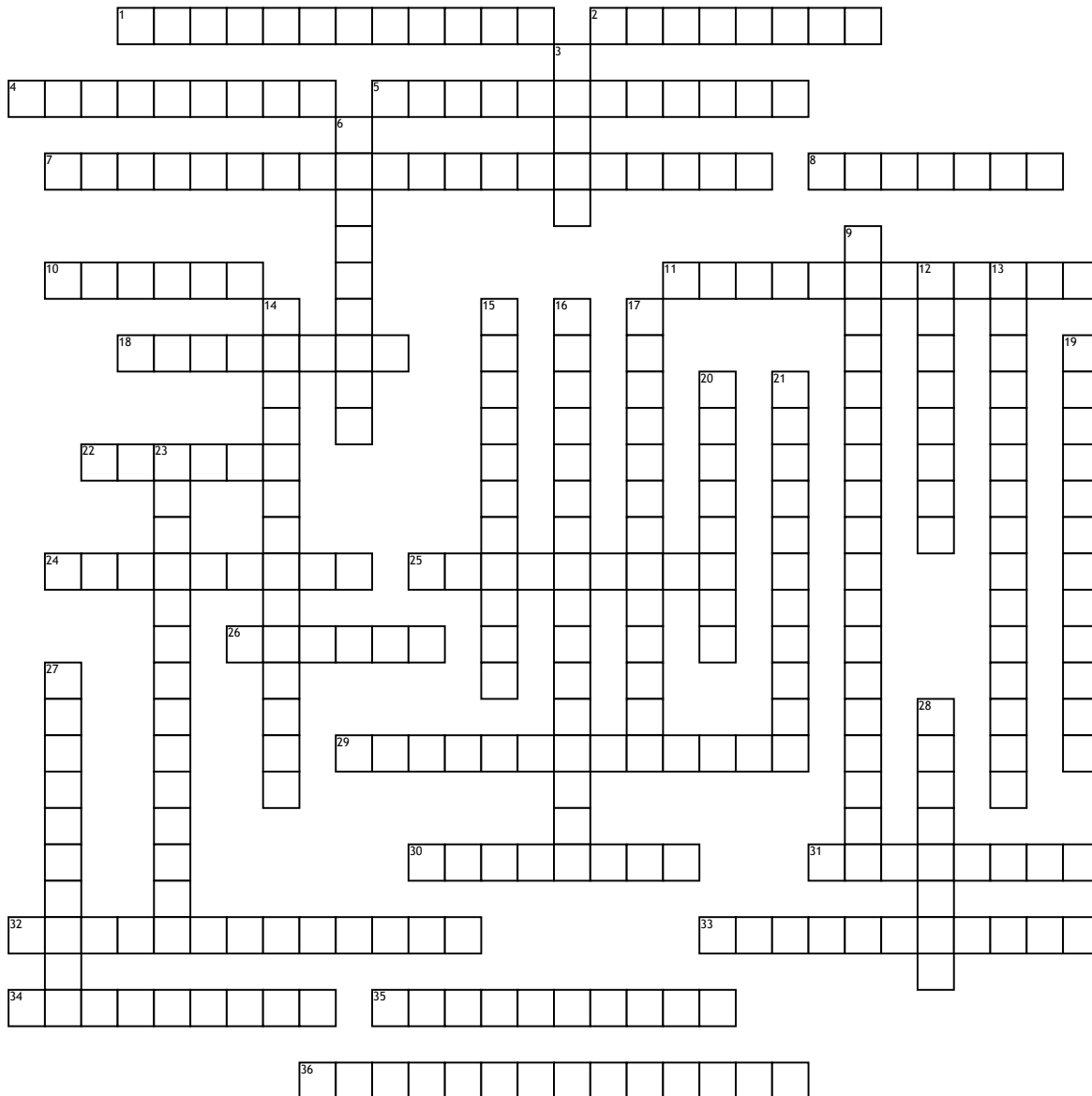


Segregation Walls Arlington County
