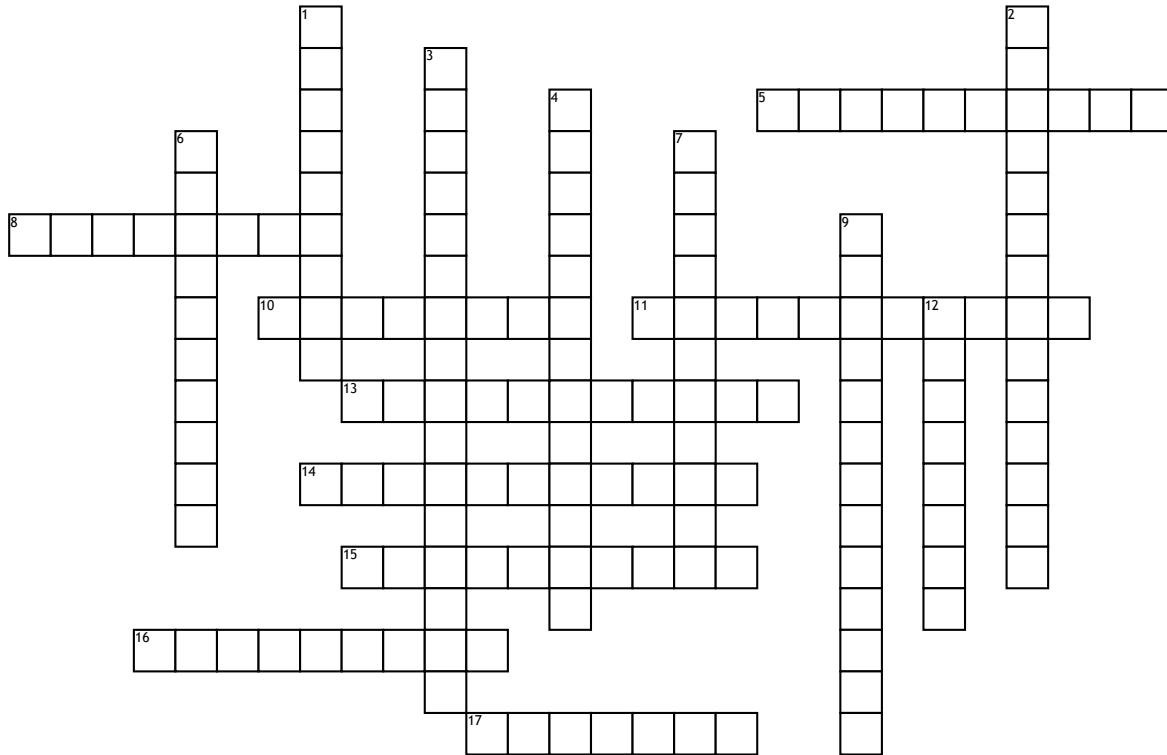

14. An abnormal increase in the number of cells in a tissue or organ, with consequent enlargement of the part or organ.

15. The branch of medicine that deals with the structure, function, and pathology of the ear.

16. Dimness of vision, especially when occurring in one eye without apparent physical defect or disease. Also called lazy eye.

17. A spiral-shaped cavity of the inner ear that resembles a snail shell and contains nerve endings essential for hearing.
