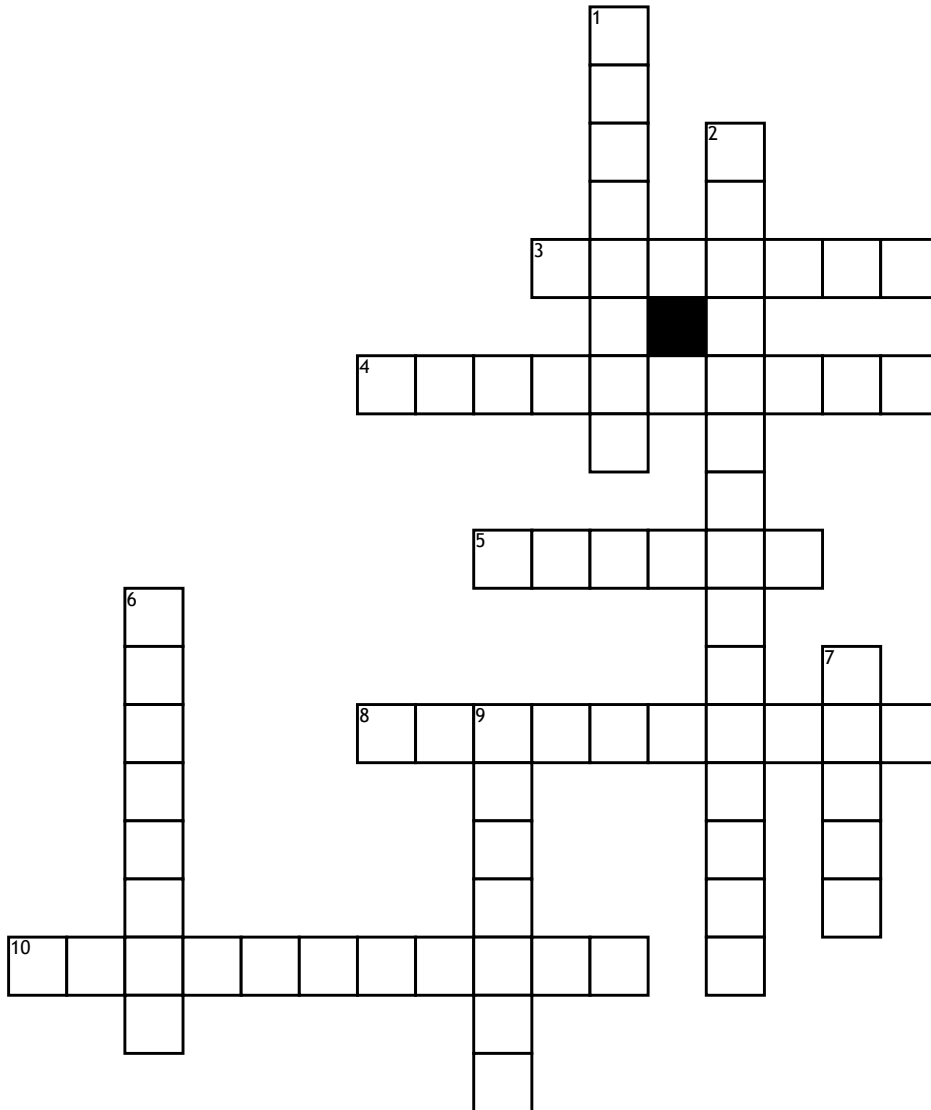


Sentence Types
