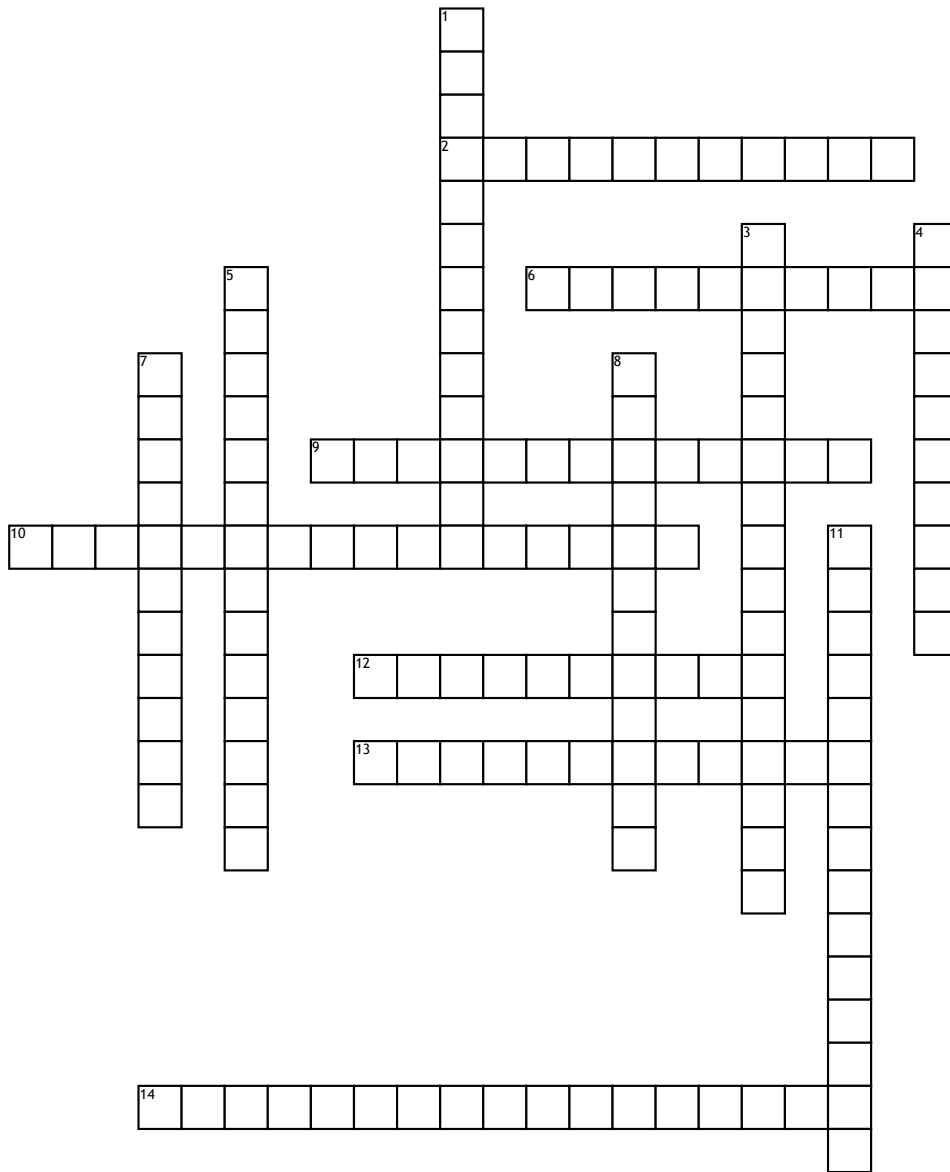


Significant Individuals

- 2. Commanded 1st US Army during D-Day Invasion, won Battle of the Bulge
- 6. founder of the largest Hispanic advertising agency in Texas. (San Antonio advertising agency: Sosa, Bromley, Aguilar, Noble, and Associates)
- 9. Advocated for women's suffrage
- 10. distinguished lawyer; appointed to the U.S. Supreme Court (1967) and established a record for supporting the voiceless American
- 12. American reformer and leader in the anti-lynching crusade and women's suffrage movement

- 13. publisher, journalist, and Black Nationalist; founder of the Universal Negro Improvement Association and African Communities League

- 14. first woman to be appointed to the Supreme Court (1981)

- 1. wrote The Jungle which exposed the conditions in the U.S. meat packing industry, causing a public uproar and leading to the passage of the Pure Food and Drug Act and Meat Inspection Act
- 3. First Lady, appointed by President Truman as a delegate to the United Nations General Assembly and became the first chairperson of the preliminary United Nations Commission on Human Rights

- 4. Founded Hull House in Chicago to help poor immigrants, part of social reform movements.

- 5. first Hispanic to serve on the Supreme Court, nominated by President Obama

- 7. Fought discrimination against migrant workers and Hispanics. Founded the United Farm Workers Organizing Committee union.

- 8. President in the 1980s - grew US economy through "Reaganomics," influenced the end of the Cold War, advocated for a strong military to deter aggression against the US

- 11. Americans who volunteered to serve as pilots fighting the Japanese in China prior to the US entering the war.
