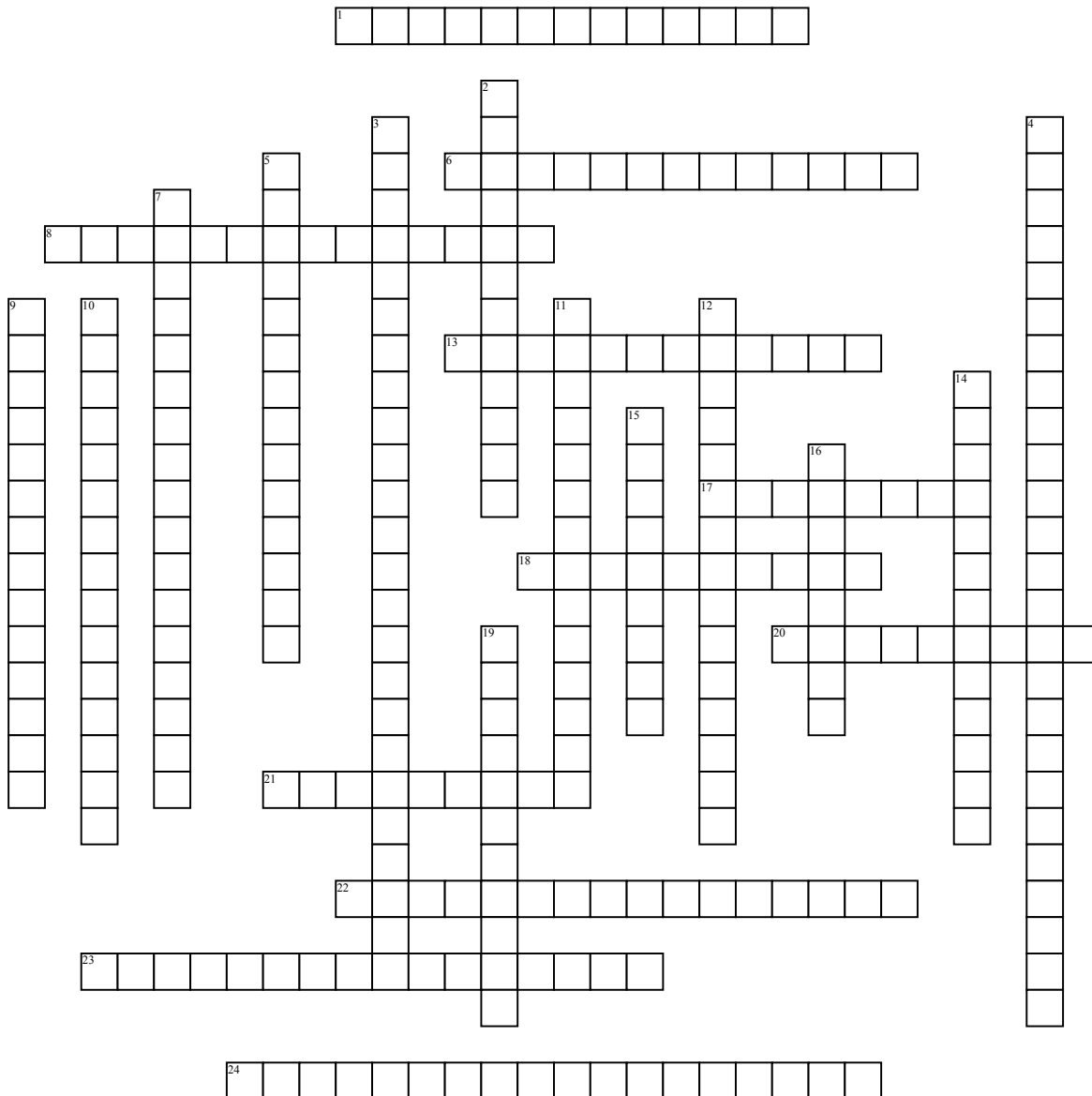


Significant People in the American Revolution

1. United States' first known naval commander in the Revolutionary War.
6. King of Great Britain and Ireland, and made some acts known as the Sugar Act of 1764 and the Stamp Act in 1765.
8. African American Spy during the Revolutionary War.
13. Led the Virginia colonial militia, and in 1776, was elected Governor of Virginia.
17. A political leader in the American Revolution, a signer of the Declaration of Independence, and formed the Sons of Liberty.
18. Famous for alerting the Colonial militia of British invasion before the Battles of Lexington and Concord.
20. Were always loyal to the British Crown, mostly known as King George III during the war.

21. Helped settle the Treaty of Paris of 1783.
 22. Helped draft the Declaration of Independence
 23. Led and commanded the Continental Army in the American Revolution.

15. Presented the idea of governmental checks and balances, which became a system for the U.S. Constitution.
16. Colonists from the 13 Colonies who rejected the British rule during the American Revolution
19. Made "Common Sense", a pamphlet that supported American Independence.
