2. The key principles of person-centeredness are: Valuing people (Treating people with dignity and respect by being aware of and supporting personal perspectives, values, beliefs and preferences. Listening to each other and working in partnership to design and deliver services), Autonomy, Life experience, Understanding relationships and Environment B. Active Listening

8. A communication technique that is used in counseling, training, and conflict resolution. It requires that the listener fully concentrate, understand, respond and then remember what is being said. H. Health Disparities

10. The conditions in which people are born, grow, work, live, and age, and the wider set of forces and systems shaping the conditions of daily life. These forces and systems include economic policies and systems, development agendas, social norms, social policies and political systems. (World Health Organization)

11. Refers to the study and causes of differences in the quality of health and healthcare across different populations. It's also the difference in the distribution or allocation of a resource between groups (usually expressed as group-specific rates).

12. An approach to customer support in which businesses make the first move to help customers. These businesses go out of their way to first find potential problems and then resolve them before customers need to ask for help.
