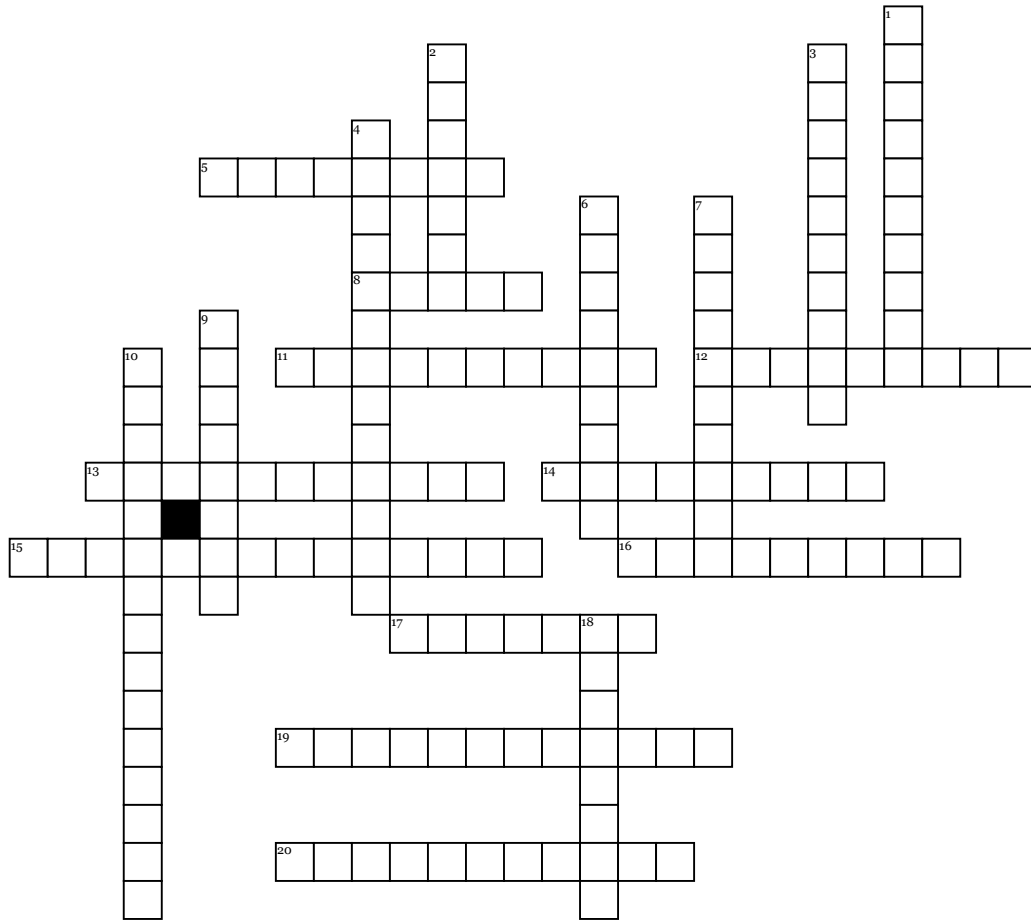


# Social Studies Choice Activities Crossword Puzzle
