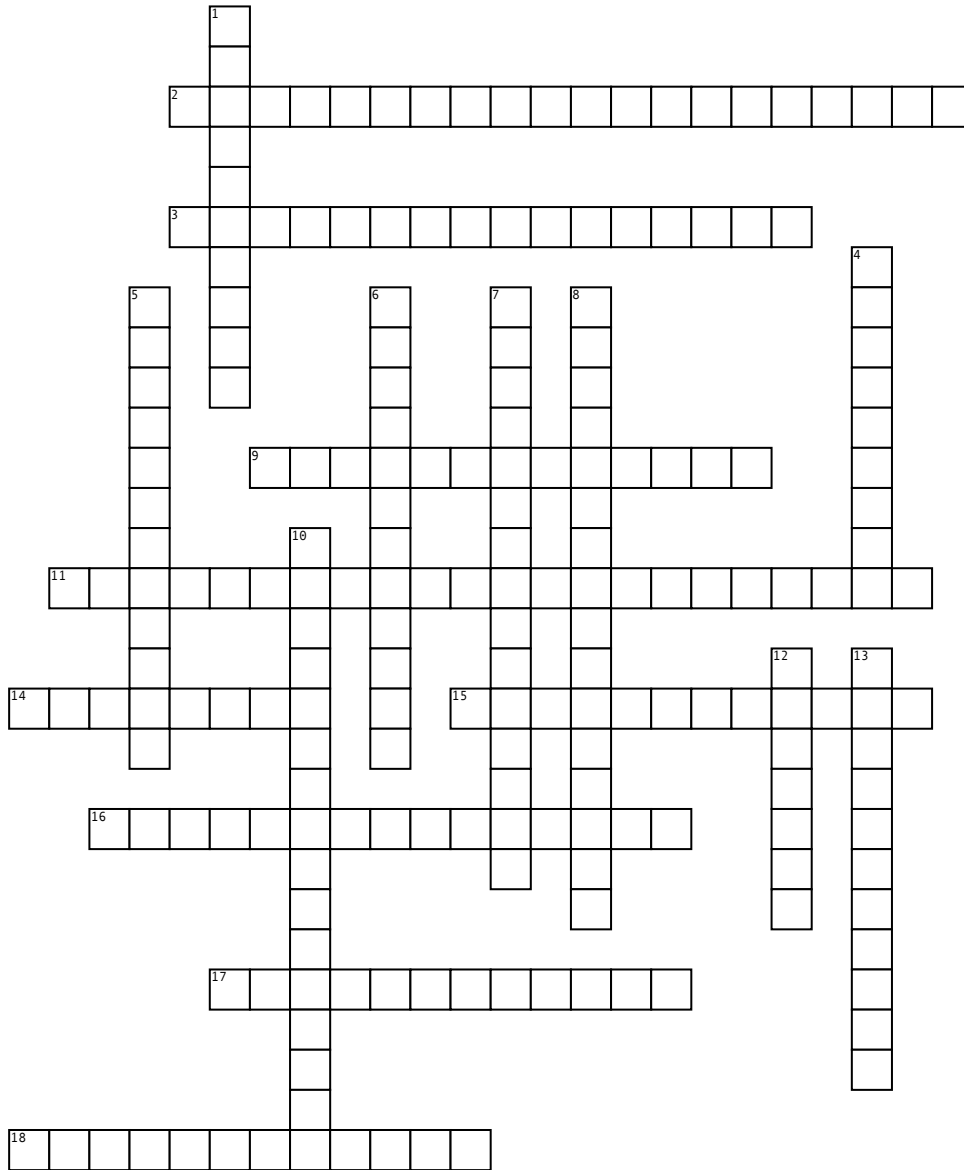

- 11. American military officer who oversaw the successful Allied occupation and rebuilding of Japan after World War 2.
- 14. A Japanese pilot trained in World War 2 to make a suicidal crash attack, especially upon a ship.
- 15. President during the end of World War 2 that gave the orders to drop the atomic bombs on Japan.
- 16. Japan's leader during World War 2 in attacks on other Asian countries and the United States. He over saw the Japanese government unconditional surrender that ended World War 2.

- 18. The 12th through 19th centuries in Japan. During this time period local rulers, powerful families or military, warlords, dominated the land, while the emperor was merely a figure head and not a significant political presence.
