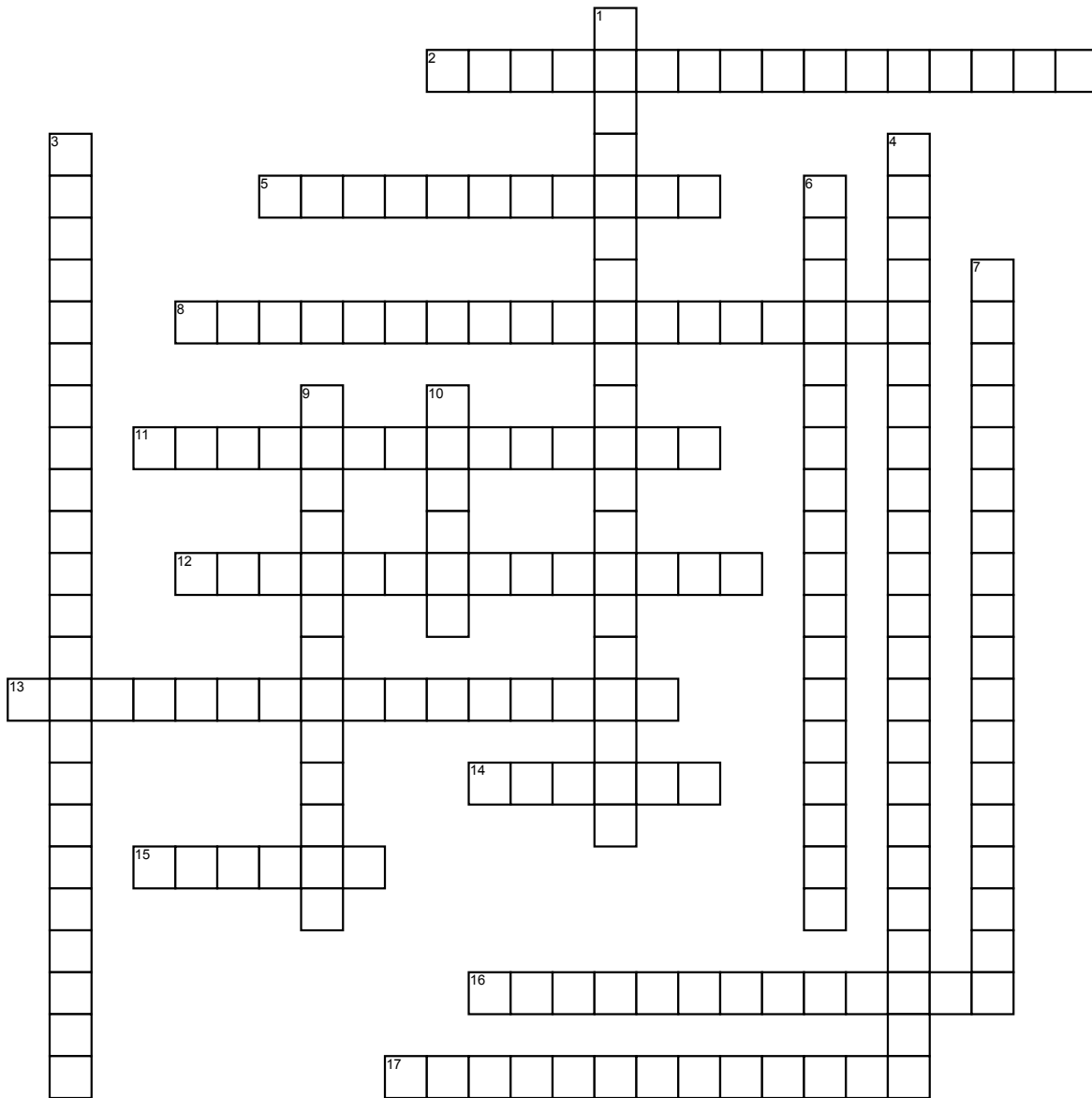

- 2.** The value of opportunities a person foregoes in order to take advantage of other opportunities.
- 5.** The holding of power or authority by people assumed to particularly able and deserving.
- 8.** The biological reproduction of the labour force including the provision of food, shelter, clothing, and health care.
- 11.** Men and women are equally encouraged to participate in the labour market, through policies against gender discrimination in employment.
- 12.** The ability of individuals to move within a social hierarchy, often used in terms of occupation or class.

- 13.** In the workplace, the tendency to feel like one is "faking" skills (despite being qualified).
- 14.** An individual's ability to make choices
- 15.** Discrimination, or the holding of irrational and prejudicial views about individuals or groups, based on their age.
- 16.** The social processes by which a population group is categorized as a race and consequently subjected to unequal treatment.
- 17.** The process surrounding the internalization and learning of culture, most of which occurs during childhood.

- 1.** Non-standard employment that is poorly paid, insecure, and unprotected

- 3.** Way of looking at the world that explores personal problems and social issues.
- 4.** The growing predominance of girls and women in middle and higher education that effectively disengages and disadvantages boys and men.
- 6.** Boarding schools for aboriginal children who were forcibly removed from their communities.
- 7.** Middle-aged adults who are caring for both elderly parents and for their own young children.
- 9.** A social and political philosophy that favours free markets and minimal government regulations
- 10.** Visible or invisible social distinctions that disqualify individuals from full social acceptance.
