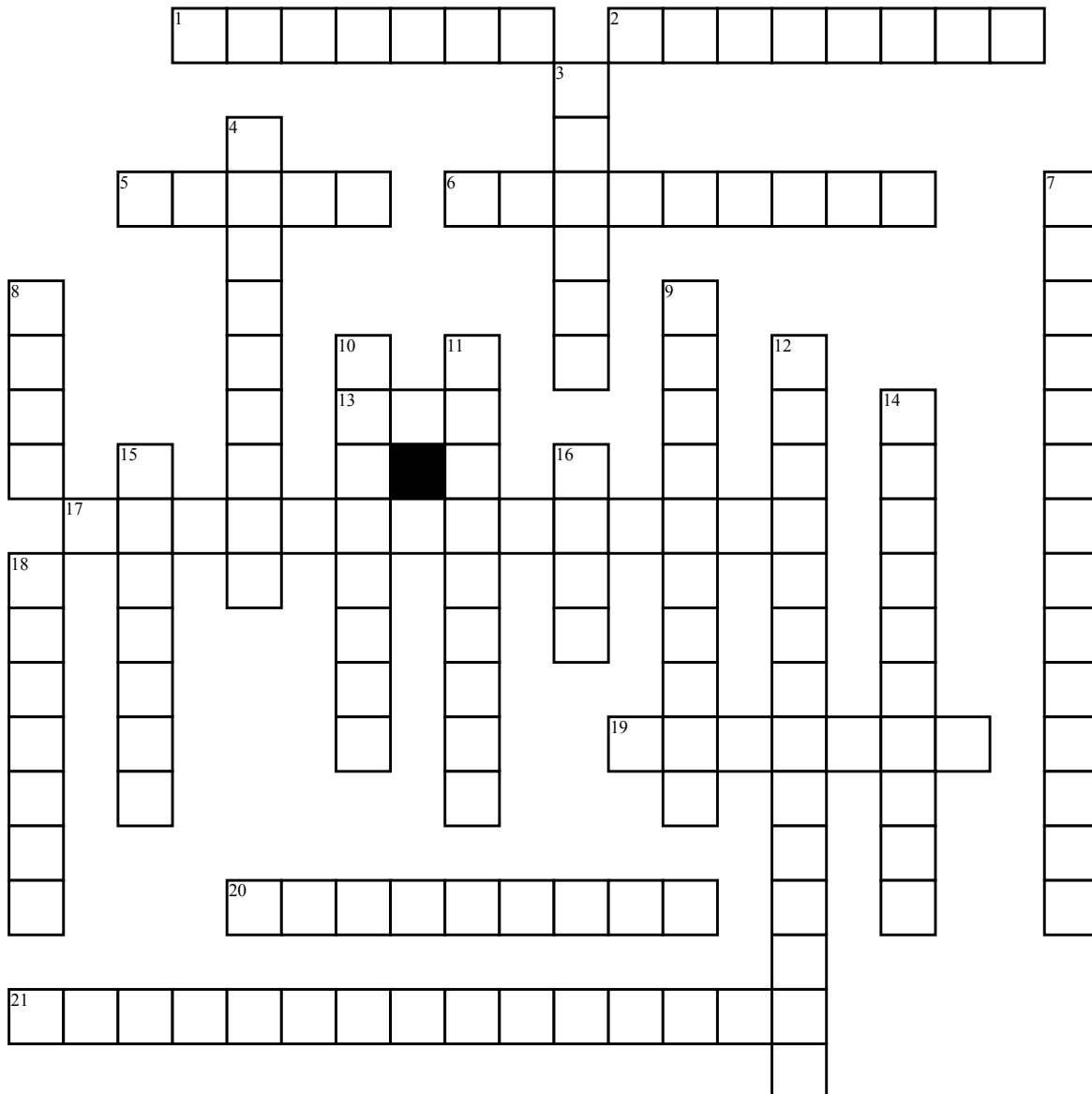


Sociology - terms to know

1. a distinct group of people who occupy a common territory and live together long enough to organize themselves into a unit different from other similar groups

2. a group of people who meet together on some regular basis, who share similar beliefs, and who practice similar rituals regarding their notion of the sacred

5. the social behavior expected of people within society

6. the scientific study of society that explores the antecedents and consequences of social behavior

17. behavior in relation to a particular group or group member which is determined or influenced by perceived racial or cultural differences in that group; it may be positive or negative

19. an organized movement that attempts to achieve objectives by asking individual consumers to refuse to purchase certain goods and services

20. a comprehensible body of beliefs about how the world is organized as represented in a culture's myths, religious ceremonies, social behaviors, and value system

11. an economic system in which gov owns productive property and controls economic production in the name of the people

14. an idea about an individual based on preconceived, standardized characteristics alleged to a whole category of people

15. religious orientation that emphasizes the symbolic nature of religious truth, accepts a variety of interpretations of scripture, and believes in a continuing unfolding of revelation from a variety of sources. true liberals disdain fundamentalists

16. a population sharing genetically or biologically inherited characteristics
