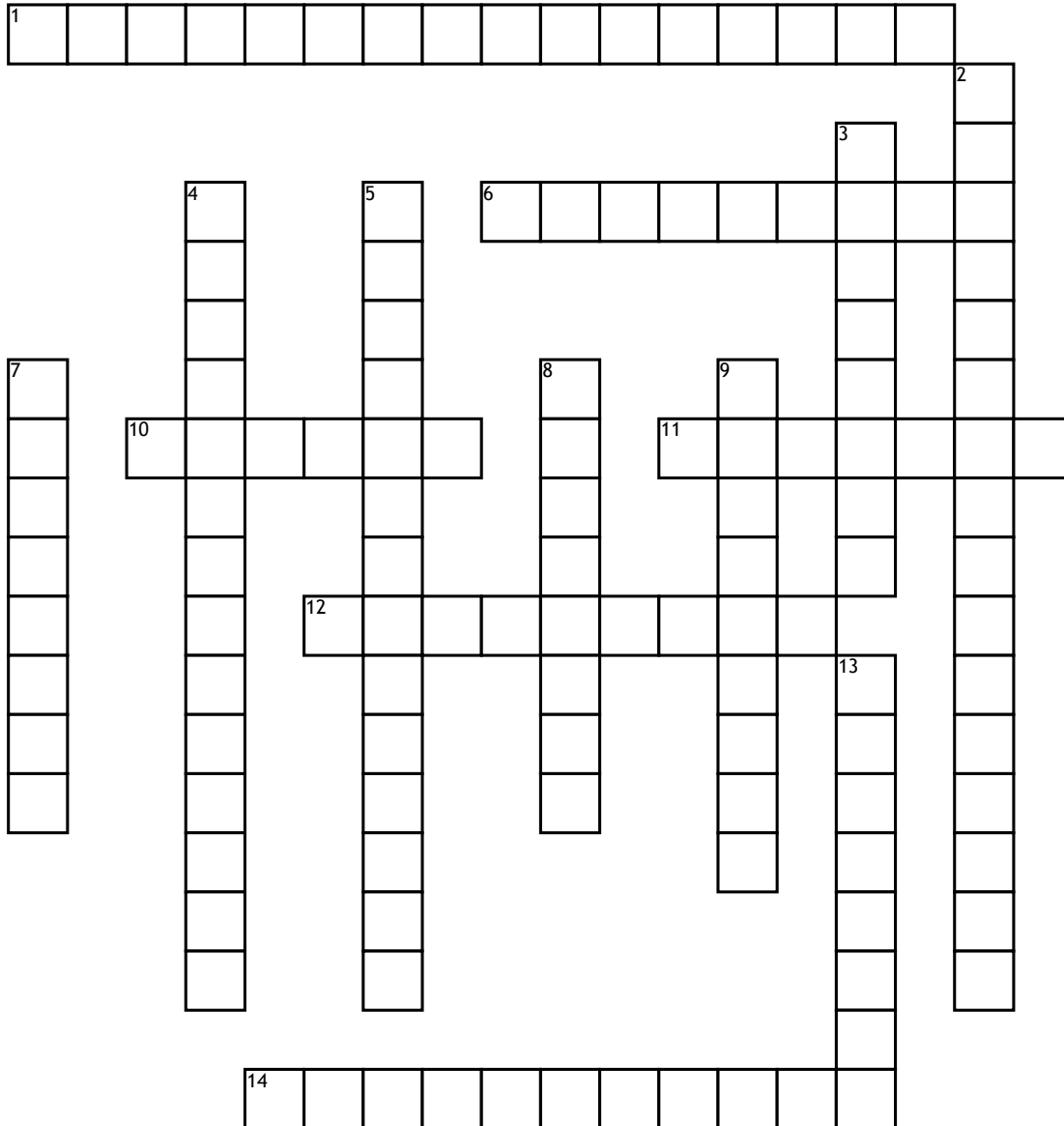


Statement of Earnings



Across

- 1. This is often abbreviated "FIT"
- 6. This refers to how often you receive a pay check
- 10. This is the amount you have left, after all deductions
- 11. This is the pay period that receives twelve checks per year
- 12. This is anything that is subtracted from your gross pay
- 14. This is the pay period that receives twenty-four checks per year

Down

- 2. This is sometimes covered only partially by your employer; it is required under the Affordable Care Act
- 3. This is the number of checks received per year if you are paid weekly
- 4. This is a tax dependent upon where you live; Pennsylvania's flat rate is 3.07%
- 5. This is a tax intended to supplement your retirement income; it is commonly abbreviated "FICA"

- 7. This is your pay before anything is subtracted
- 8. This is a tax that provides health care for those over the age of 65
- 9. This is often an easy way to save for retirement; many times employer's match contributions
- 13. This is the pay period that receives 26 checks per year
