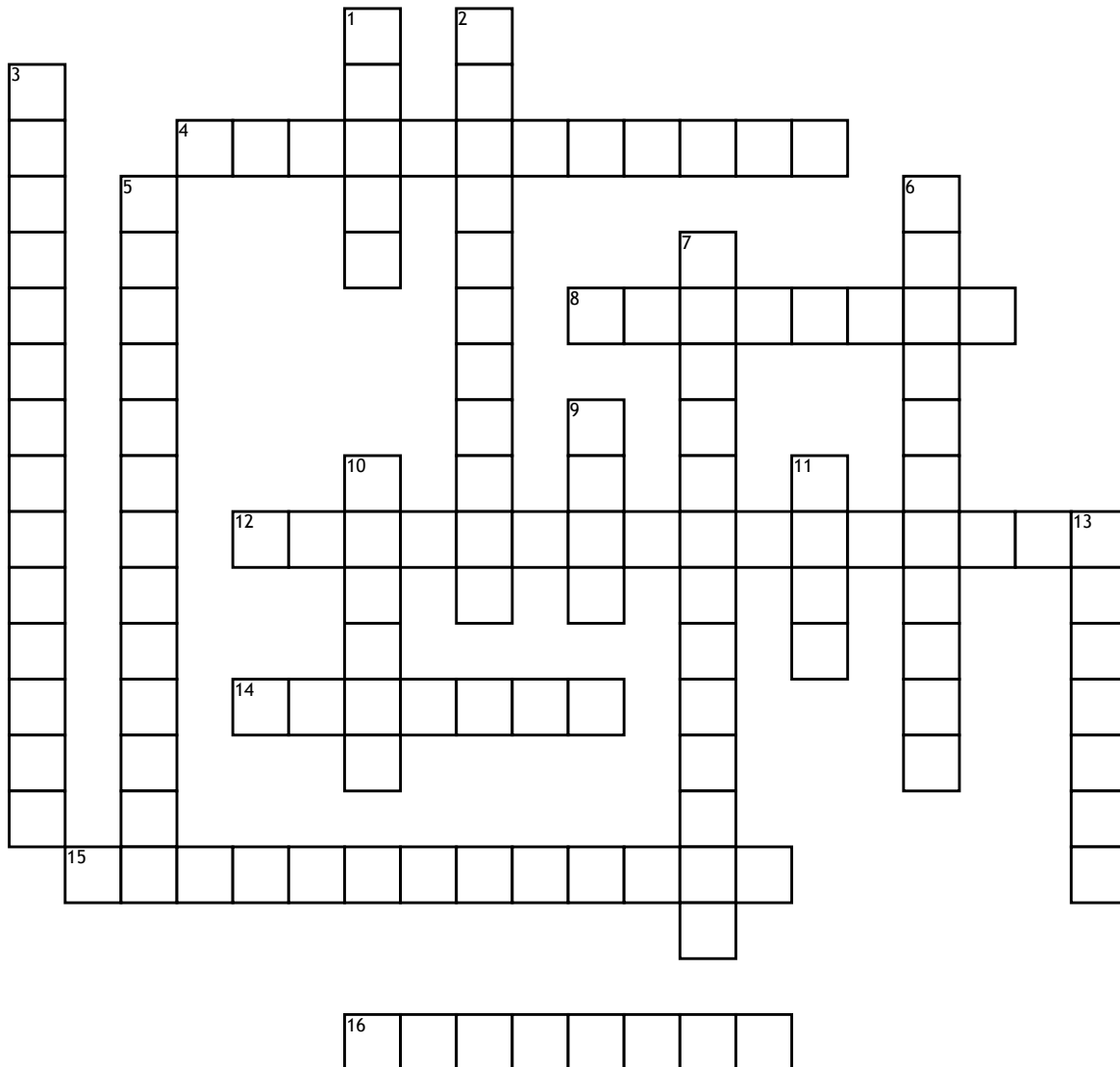


# Stitching by Machine and Hand



## Across

4. Decorative or functional stitching when placed on the outside of a garment.
8. 10-12 stitches per inch.
12. Row of standard stitching is placed on the outside of a garment in the groove of a seam line.
14. A decorative stitch used to finish an unhemmed fabric or blanket.
15. Stitching placed along the bias or curved edges to prevent stretching.
16. Diagonal stitches over the edge of the fabric, spacing them evenly apart.

## Down

1. The longest stitch length, 6 stitches per inch.
2. Fold the hem or facing edge back about 1/4 in. Take small stitch in the garment, catching only 1-2 threads. then take a tiny stitch diagonally above in the hem or facing.
3. Keeps the facing or the bottom layer of fabric rolled out of sight. Stitch through the facing and seam allowances.
5. Very shorts stitches used to strengthen areas that will be trimmed.

6. Stitching in the same direction as the fabric grain, prevents stretching.
7. Secures the ends of a row of stitching by sewing backward.
9. Almost invisible used to attach one folded edge to another piece of fabric.
10. It is a back-and-forth stitch used where a straight stitch will not suffice.
11. A 5/8 inch line of stitching joining two pieces of fabric are sewn together.
13. Slanted stitches used for hems with seam binding.
