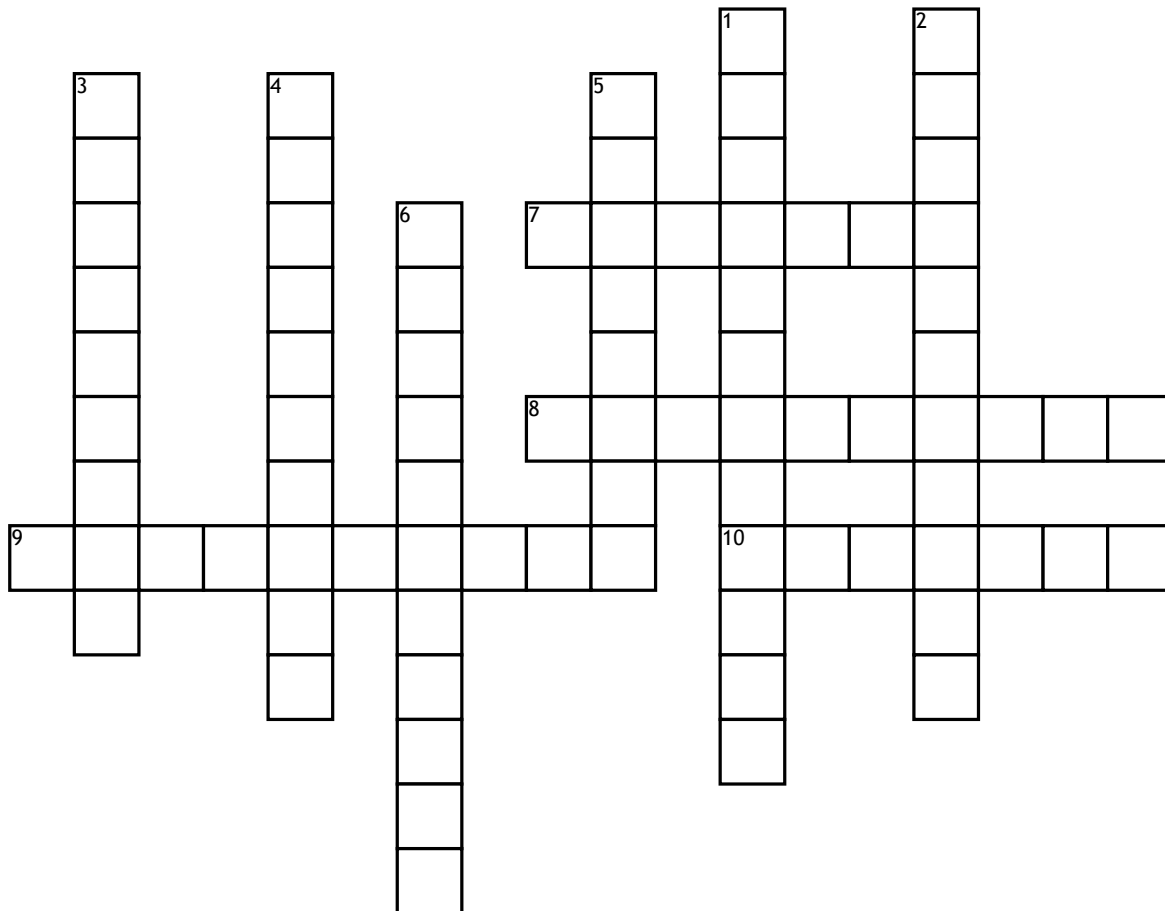

7. What the site marking must be after the patient is prepped and draped.
8. The person who performs the briefing
9. A period of time during or immediately after wound closure to transfer important information to care teams responsible for the patient after surgery.
10. A period of time after induction and before puncture or incision where verification of the patient, intended procedure, and visualization of the marked site of the procedure takes place.

1. The step in identifying the proper patient, procedure, and side/site.
2. When the time-out is to be performed before the surgery takes place.
3. The surgeon does this to begin the time-out
4. A side of the body or site designation.
5. A period of time immediately before administration of any type of anesthesia and/or sedation in order to confirm the safety of proceeding.
