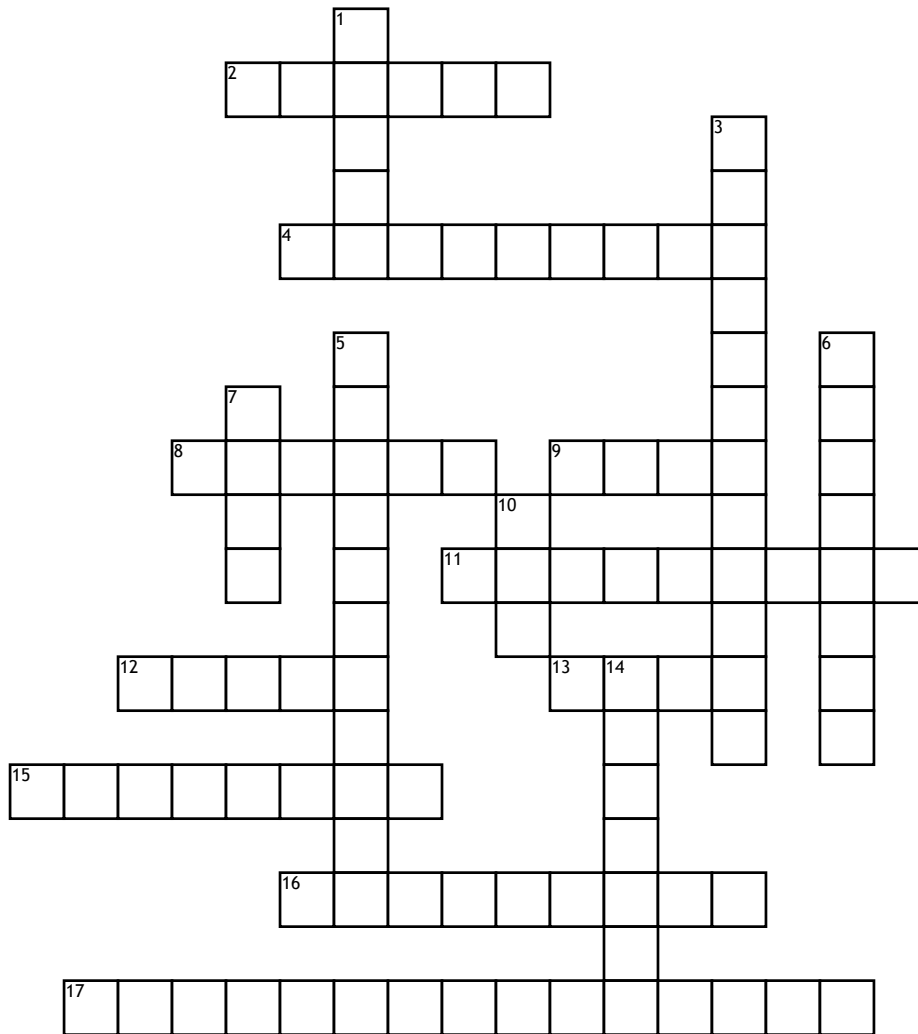

- 4. Originated in Berkshire, County, England. Is black in color with 6 white points
- 8. Newborn swine

- 11. Developed in England, imported to the U.S. in 1830 from England to Ohio
- 12. Developed in New Jersey from Red Berkshire. Was established in 1885 and solid red in color

- 13. Black and white in color and is known for producing fast growing and feed efficient offspring
- 15. Originated in Pietrain, Belgium
- 16. Originated in Southern Scotland and Northern England. Known as the "Old English Breed". Black in color with a white belt
- 17. 3 months, 3 weeks, 3 days or 114 days

- 3. Developed in Pennsylvania from Cheshire, Lincolnshire, and Yorkshire breeding. Are all white with some freckles
- 5. Developed between 1800 & 1850 in Ohio
- 6. Imported to the U.S. in 1934, originated in Denmark. Are solid white in color with long ears that droop over the eyes

- 10. Mature female swine
- 14. Scientific name for swine
