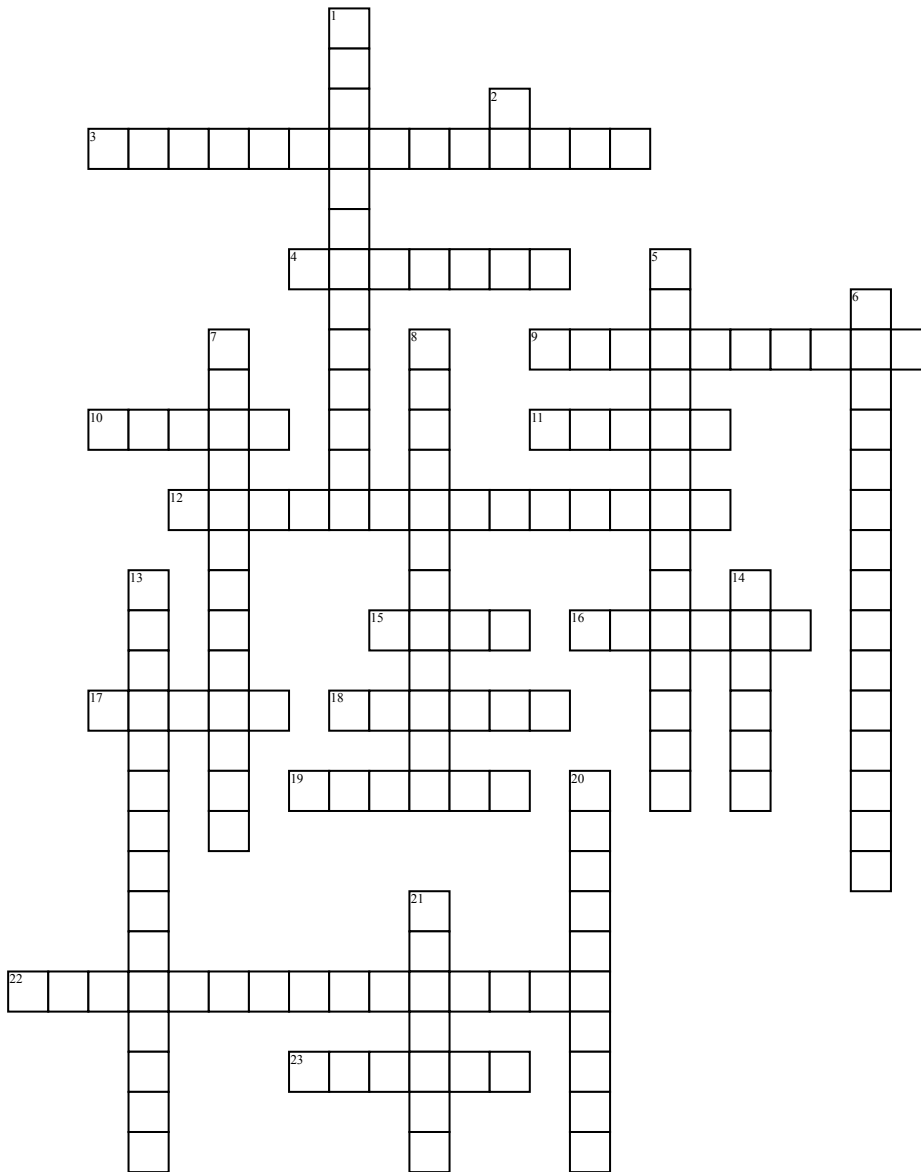


THE SOUND AND THE FURY
