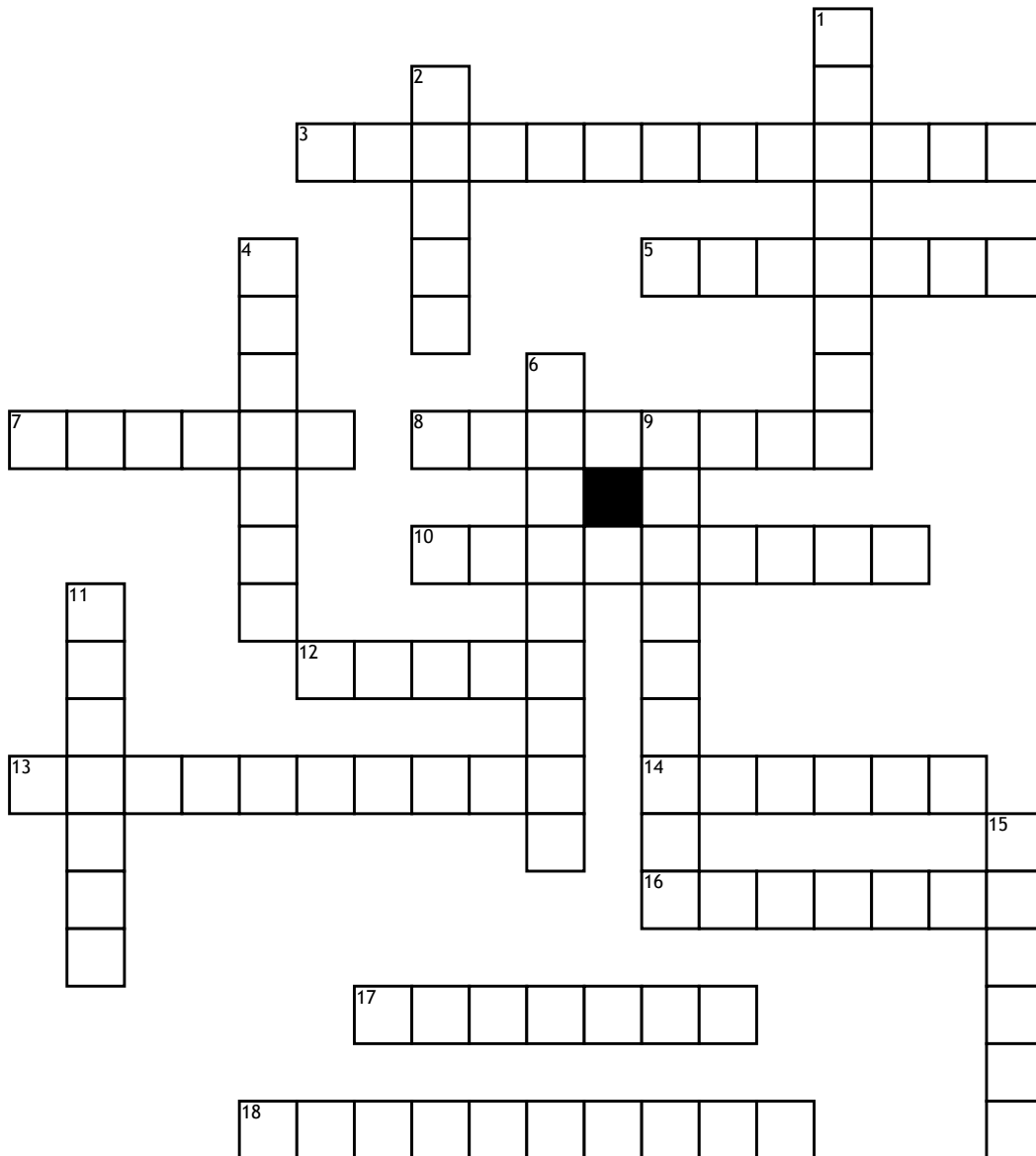


# Tension Brewing

10. A place where Christians go to be purified of their sin before entering Heaven (Catholic doctrine)

13. A monk who called for a rejection of worldliness and ungodliness in Renaissance Florence
14. The leaders of the Church usually took their side against the king
16. Pursued by the Greeks, especially Aristotle, who taught that nature should be studied and observed to find patterns
17. The church leaders wanted only these men to study and interpret the Bible
18. Obtained through repentance, good deeds, and increasingly, money, to shorten one's time in purgatory

1. A rising class of wealthy people including merchants, craftsmen and bankers
2. The most important book to people in the Middle Ages

4. State ruler who often competed with the pope for power in the Holy Roman Empire
6. A person who had a church office; in the Middle Ages, a position which offered an education
9. The princes of the Holy Roman Empire were willing to accept these from the Church, but not its political authority
11. Many burghers began to feel more of this toward their kings than toward the Church
15. Also called "the mind" - Greek philosophers such as Plato believed that it led to Truth
