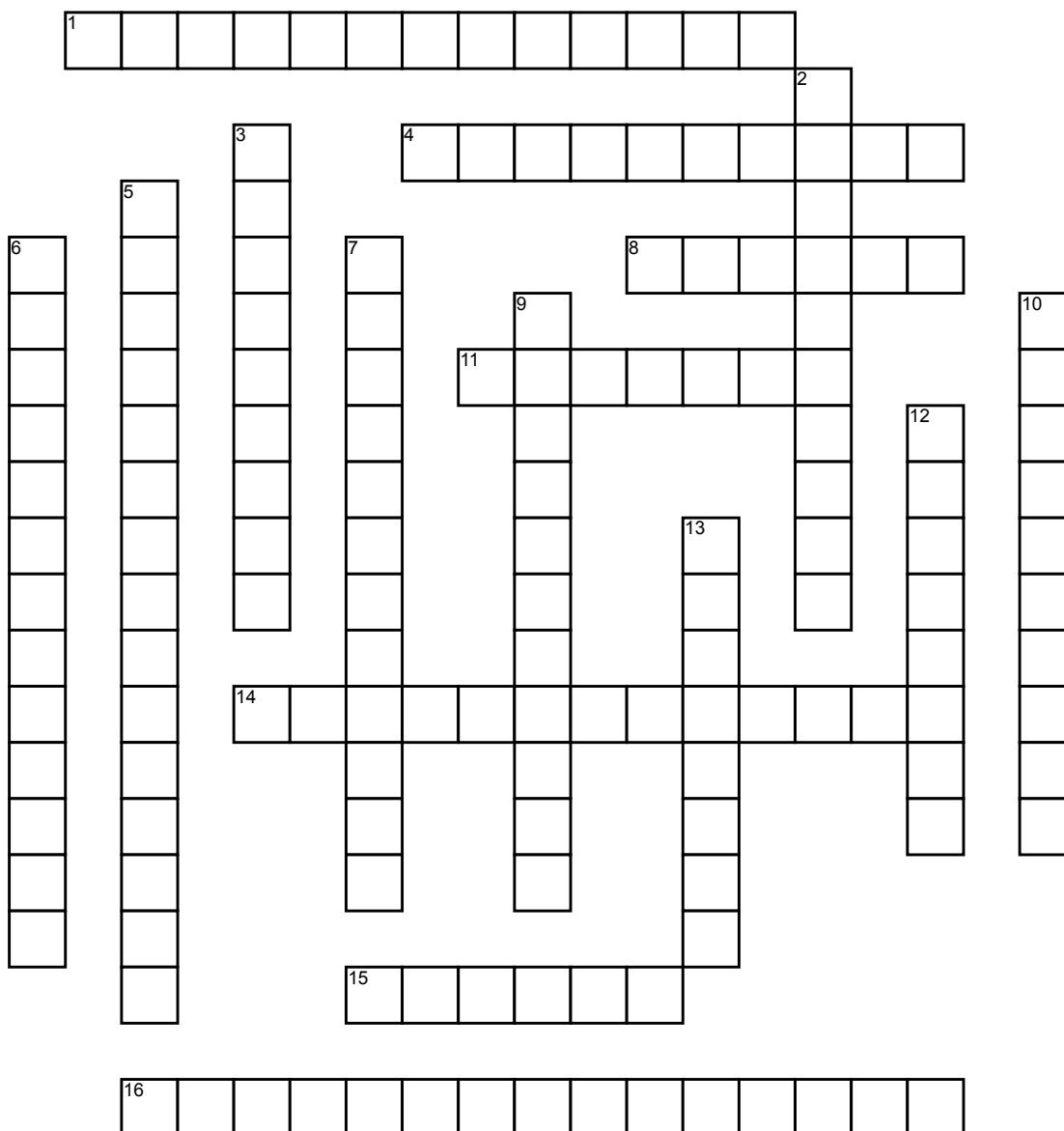


# Tension and Suspense - Creating Mystery

- 8. a word or phrase that modifies or qualifies an adjective, verb, or other adverb or a word group, expressing a relation of place, time, circumstance, manner, cause, degree, etc. (e.g., gently, quite, then, there ).
- 11. The complete absence of sound

- 3. The quality of being open to more than one interpretation. Holding information back from the reader

- 7. The occurrence of the same letter or sound at the beginning of closely connected words. Draws the reader to something specific in the text.

- 9. A point of view where the story is narrated by one character at a time. This character may be speaking about him or herself or sharing events that he or she is experiencing.
- 10. A word naming an attribute of a noun, such as sweet, red, or technical.

- 13. A figure of speech that directly refers to one thing by mentioning another.
