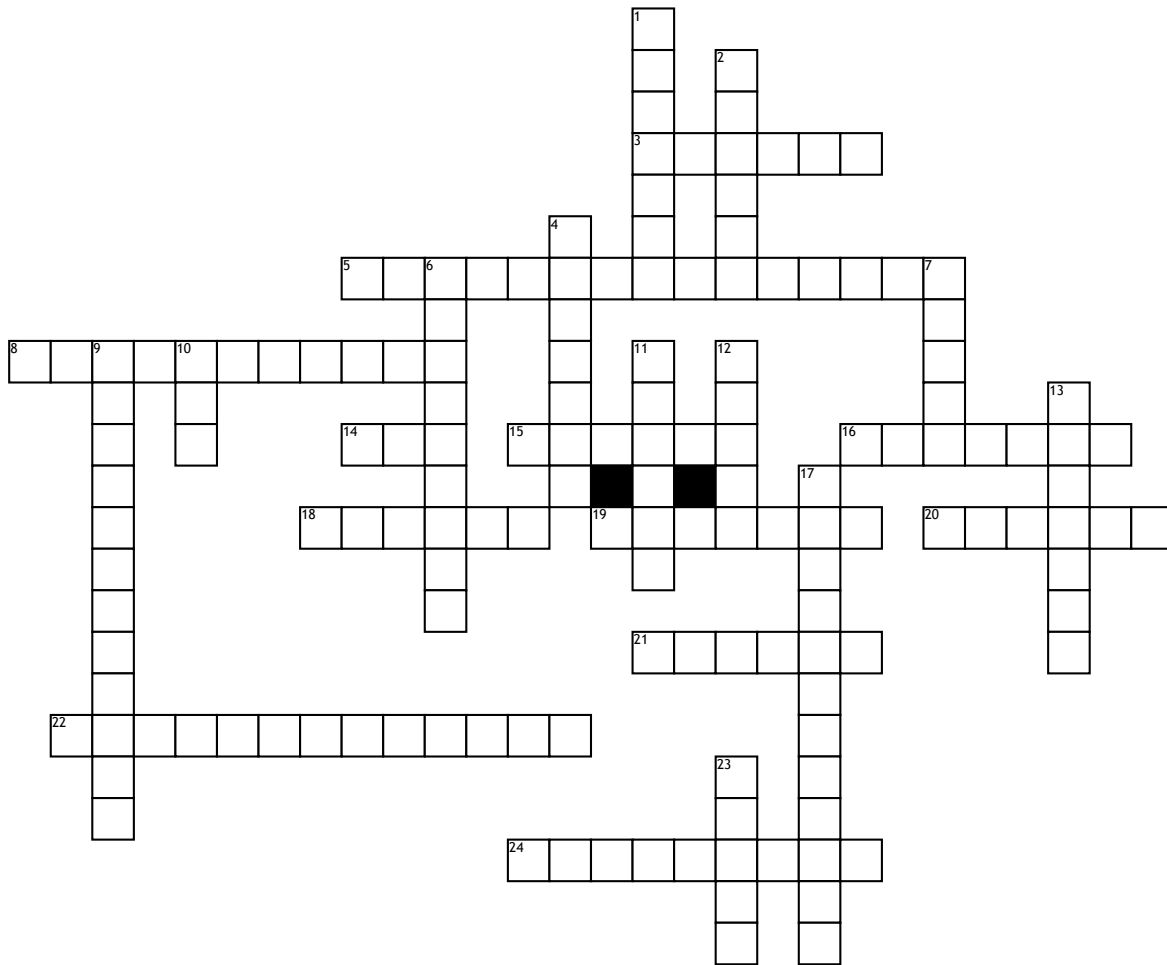


The Boy at the Top of the Mountain
