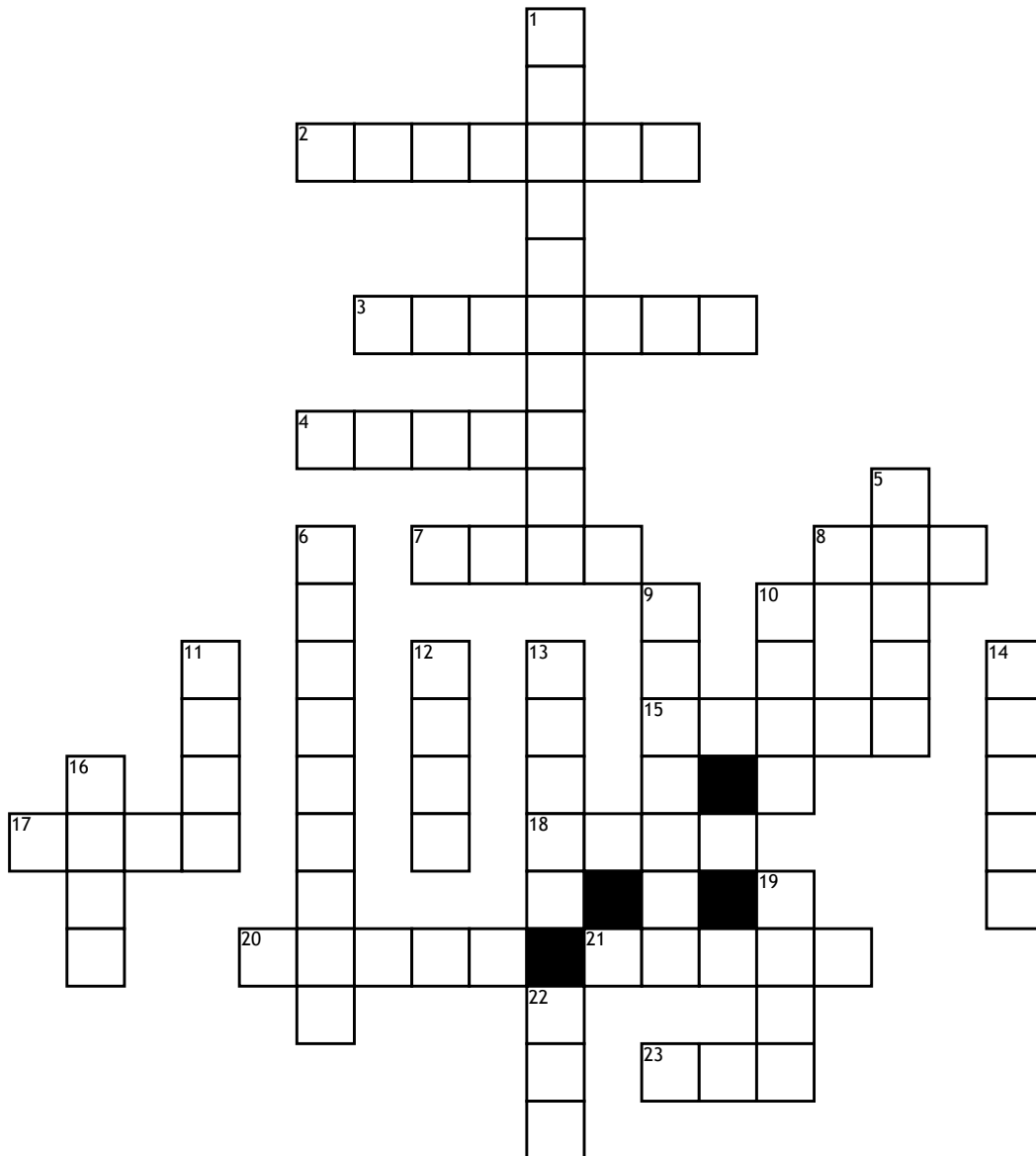

- 2. heavy material placed in the hold of a ship to give it stability
- 3. located away from the wind; downwind
- 4. the rear part of a ship or boat
- 7. to catch the breath convulsively and audibly (as with shock)
- 8. Front of a ship
- 15. A hole dug in the ground to receive a coffin or dead body, typically marked by a stone or mound
- 17. a pack of playing cards
- 18. A sound made by a person expressing great pride or triumph. 'she gave a little crow of triumph
- 20. very serious

21. serious and unrelenting, especially in the assertion of authority and exercise of discipline

23. Bend the head or upper part of the body as a sign of respect to authority like a king

- 1. a wind blowing almost continually toward the equator from the northeast
- 5. to plunge into a liquid, drench; to put out quickly, extinguish
- 6. The right side of a ship
- 9. A boat used for towing and pushing ships
- 10. to examine closely; to look over quickly but thoroughly
- 11. the land alongside or sloping down to a body of water like a river, lake, or ocean

12. maneuver is used to change the aircraft heading Example: The pilot banked his plane to the left in order to get a better view of what was happening on the ground

13. A motion that is an up-or-down movement of the bow and stern of the ship upon the ocean

14. to throw (a baseball) to a batter to toss (something, such as balled up paper into a trash can)

16. a platform in a ship serving usually as a structural element and forming the floor for its compartments

19. a Gang plank that hooked ships together
