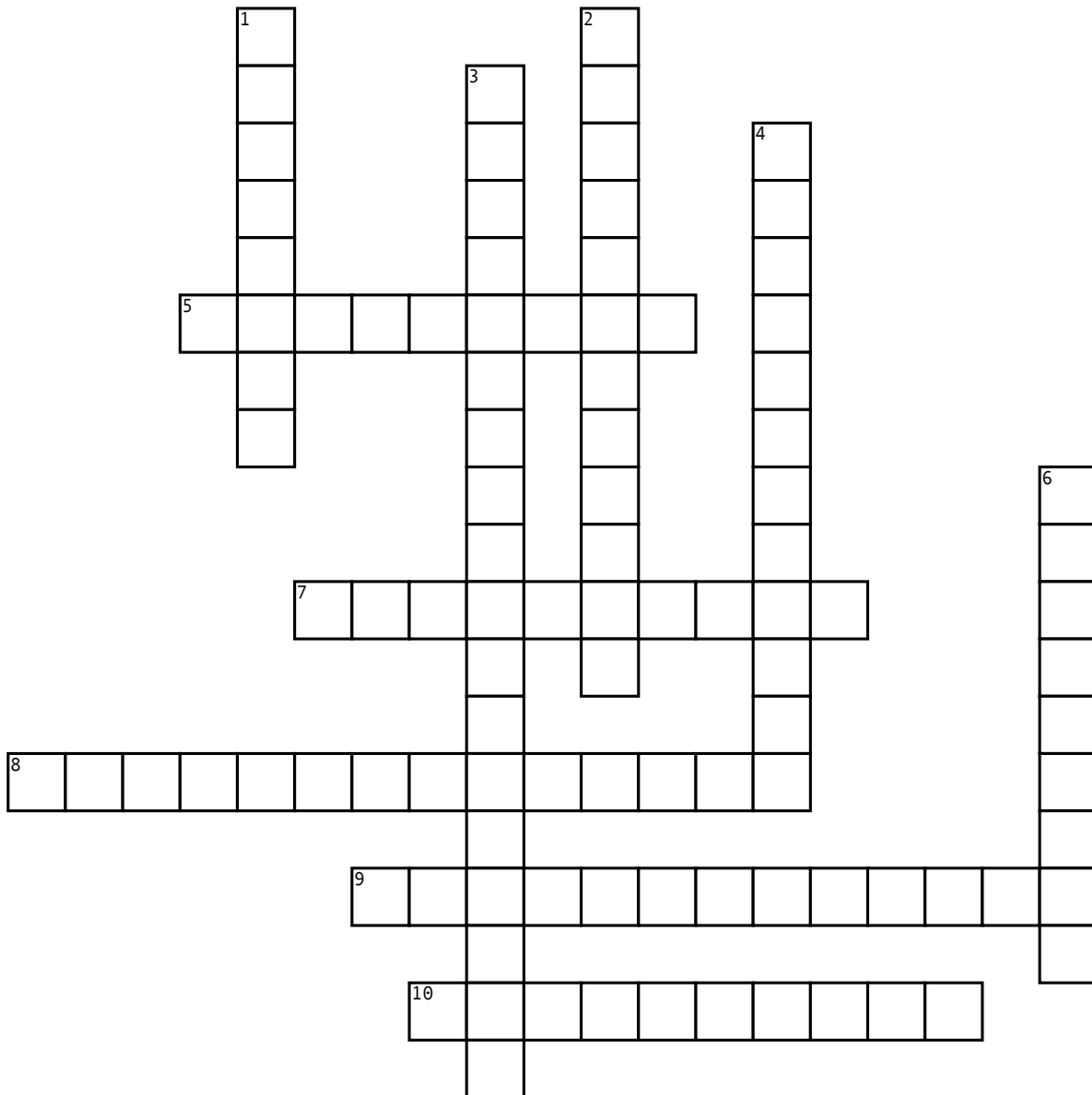

7. An economic system with private ownership of goods, prices, production, and the distribution of goods that are determined by competition in a free market
8. The policy of President Truman to provide military and economic aid to Greece and Turkey or any country threatened by Communism
9. An international organization, with headquarters in NYC, formed to promote international peace, signed by 51 founding countries in 1945
10. Military conflict (1954-1975) between South Vietnam, supported by United States forces, and Communist North Vietnam

1. A communist led army and guerrilla force in South Vietnam that fought its government and was supported by North Vietnam
2. A program by which the United States gave \$13 billion of economic aid to European countries to help them rebuild after WWII
3. A confrontation between the United States and Soviet Union in 1962 over the presence of missile sites in Cuba; one of the "hottest" periods of the Cold War
4. The turning point of the Vietnam War
6. A political theory advocating a society in which all property is publicly owned and each person works and is paid according to their abilities and needs, a single authoritarian party controls both the political and economic systems
