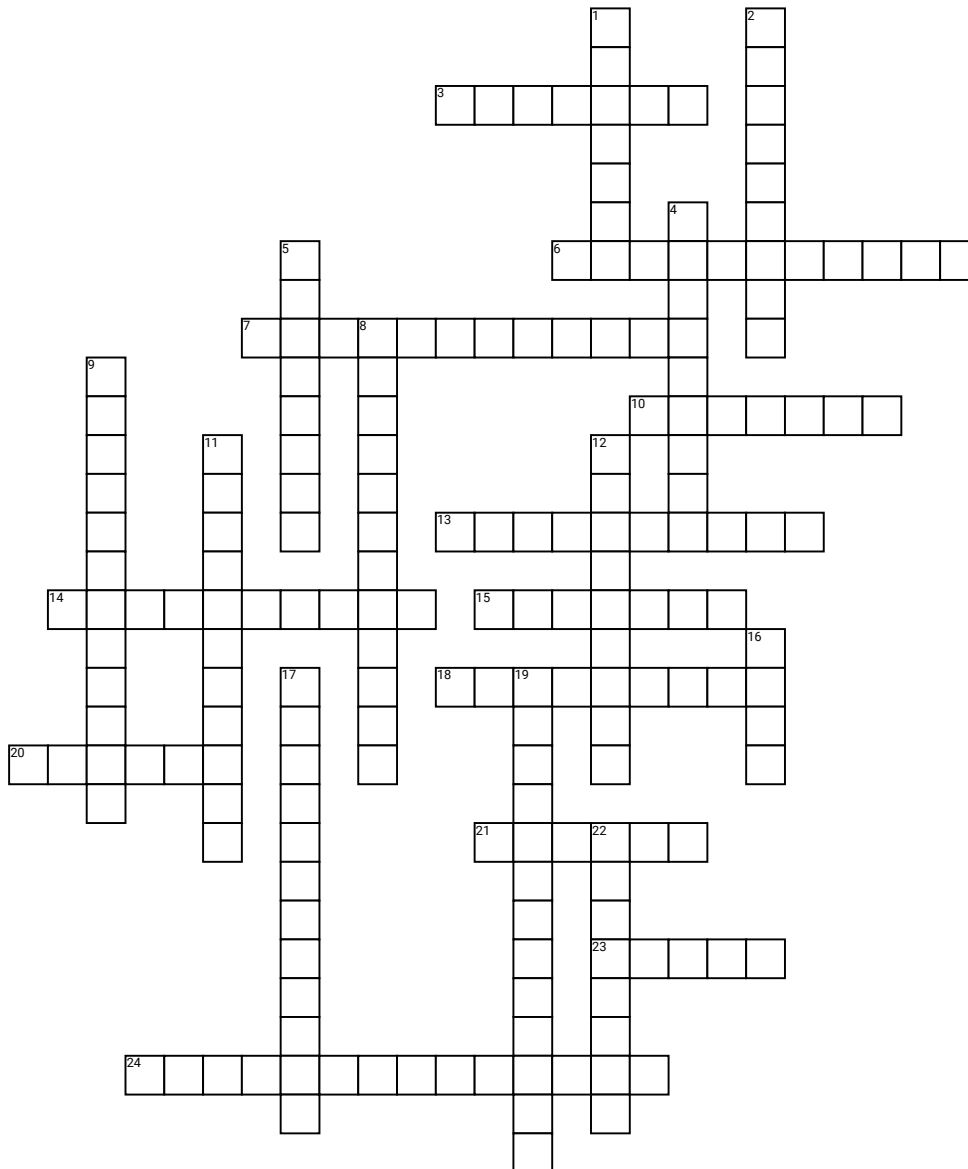


# The Declaration of Independence Vocabulary
