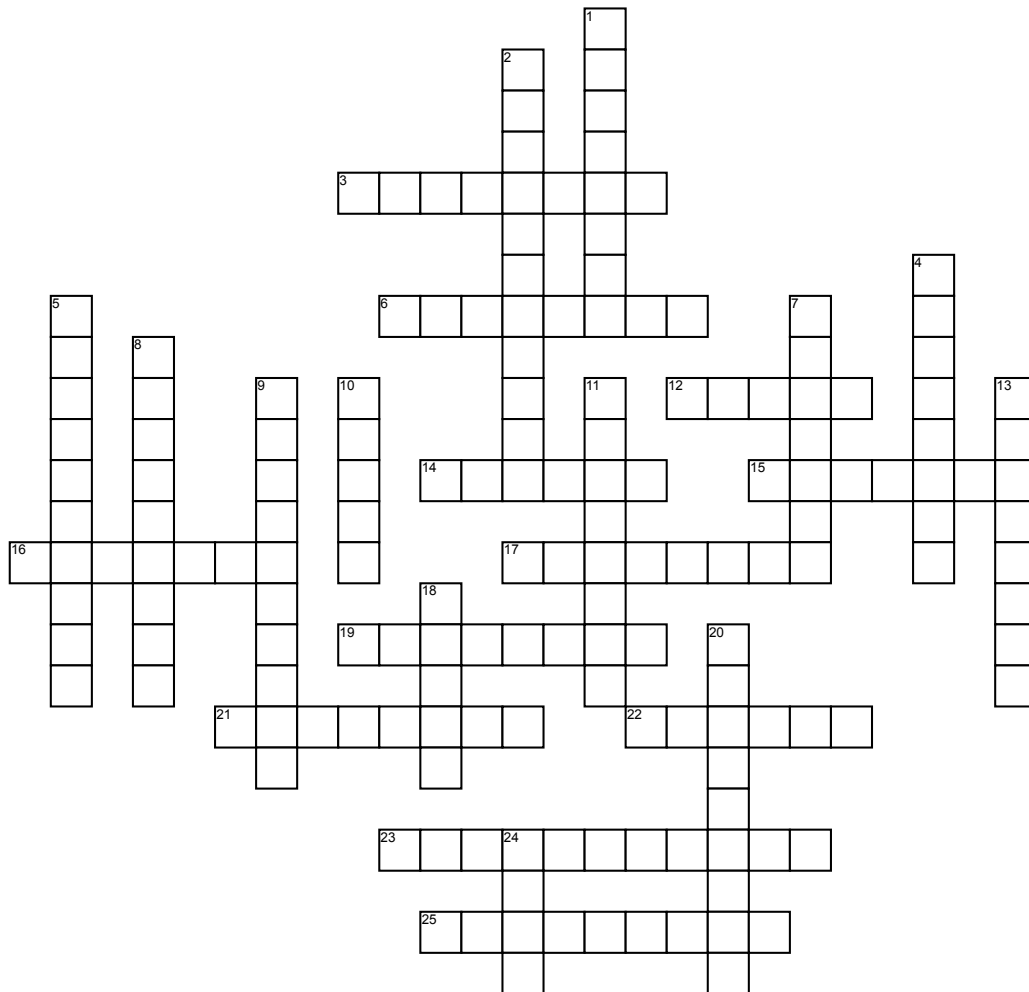


The Devil and His Boy
