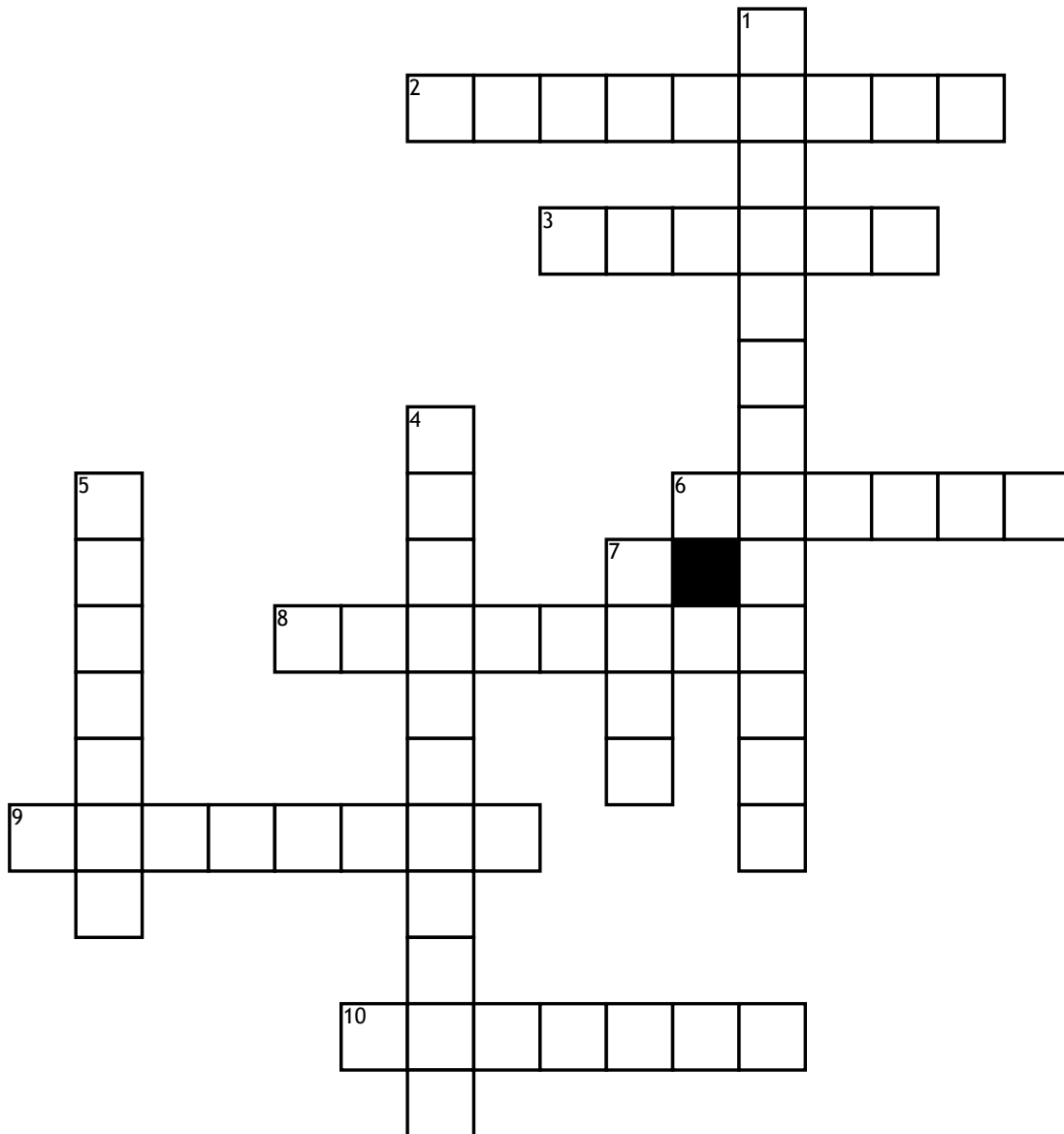


The Era of Andrew Jackson
