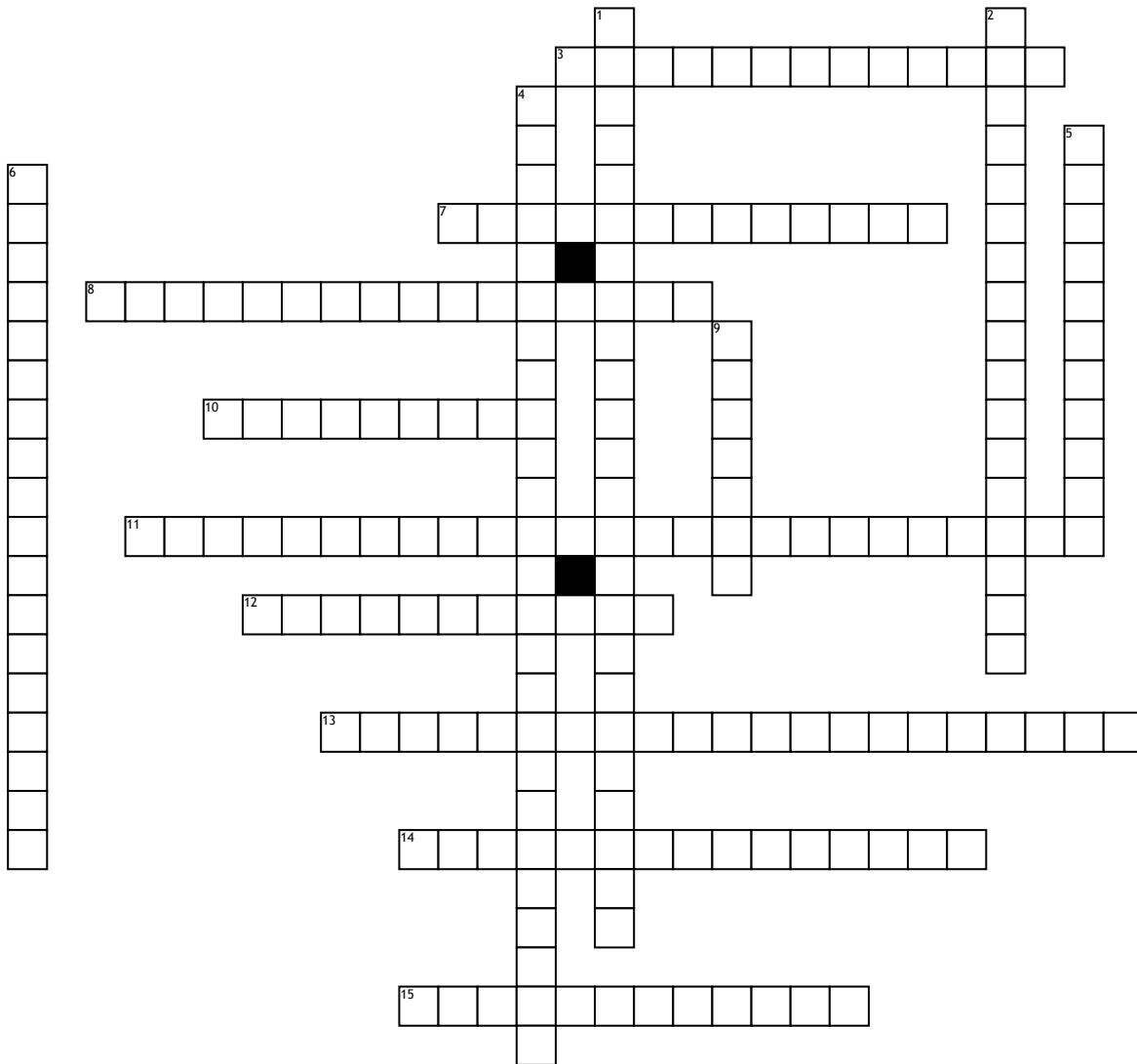


The New Deal Terms

- 3. a new set of programs in the spring of 1935 including additional banking reforms, new tax laws, and new relief programs
- 7. informal talks over the radio; sat by the White House fireplace; gained the confidence of the people
- 8. FDR's wife and the First Lady; known for her active role in the administration
- 10. Groups of WW1 vets that marched to D.C. in 1932
- 11. Provided employment to young men by sending them to camps in national parks and forests

- 12. all the banks were ordered to close until new laws could be passed
- 13. a critic of the new deal; created the National Union for Social Justice; wanted monetary inflation and the nationalization of the banking system
- 14. government practice of spending more than is taken in from taxes
- 15. October 29, 1929

- 1. one of the most depressed regions of the USA
- 2. changed a high tax imports thereby leading to less trade between America and foreign countries along with some economic retaliation

- 4. gave the president power over the banking system and set up a system by which banks would be reorganized or reopened
- 5. During this time, congress passed into law every request of FDR enacting more major legislation than any single Congress in history
- 6. American president elected at the height of the Great Depression
- 9. a series of reforms enacted by the Franklin Roosevelt administration between 1933 and 1942 with the goal of ending the Great Depression
