 3. Made it illegal for "holding companies" to buy stocks in another company; empowers labor unions, allowing for strikes, boycotts, and collective bargaining
 4. This created a progressive Federal Income Tax in 1913
 5. The Women's suffrage movement, culminated with the passage of this amendment in 1920
