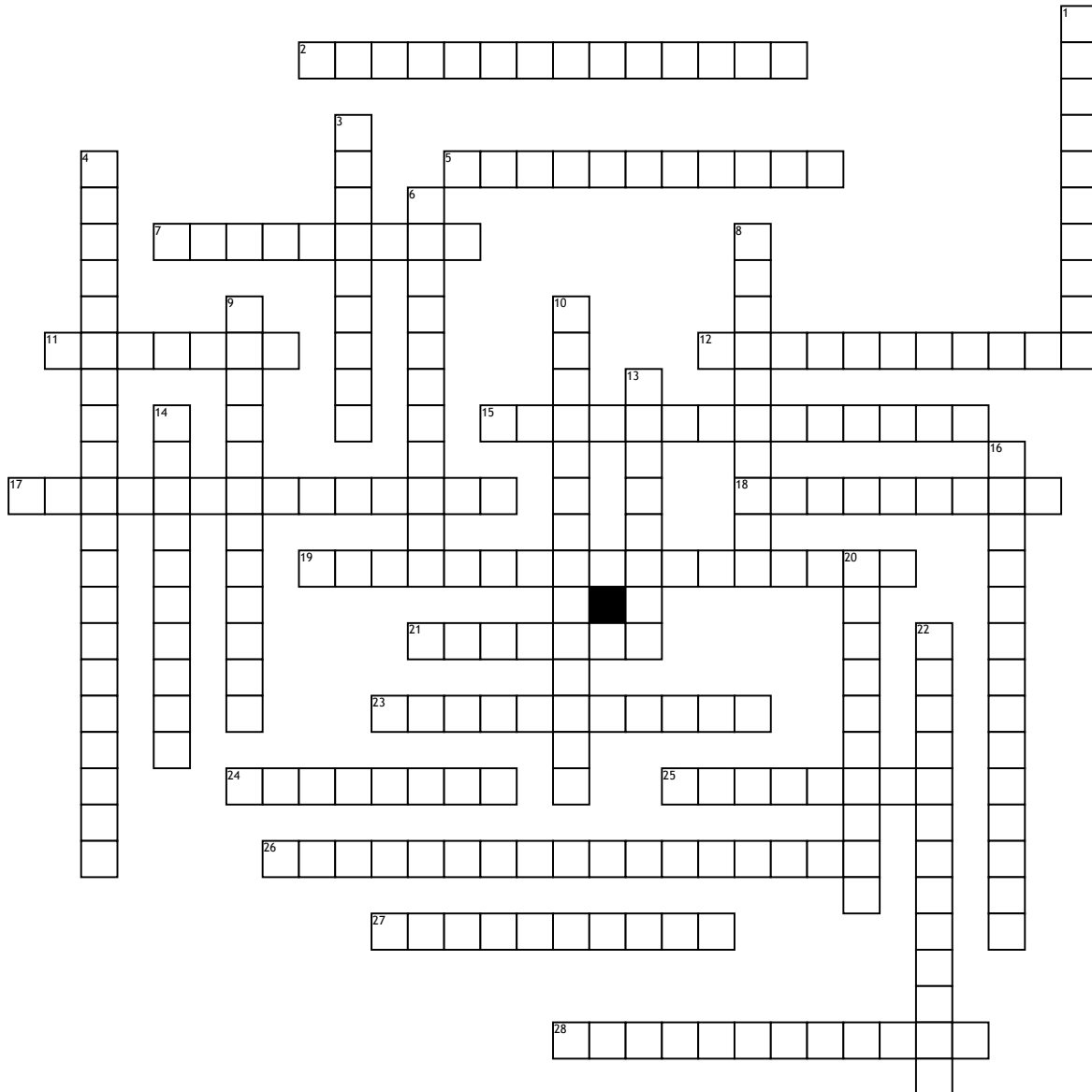


# The Roaring 20's

2. Large movement of African Americans from the South to take jobs in Northern factories  
 5. Also known as the National Prohibition Act - It was the "power" behind the 18th Amendment  
 7. 1925 Tennessee State Law that prohibited public school teachers from denying the bible's account for man's origin and prevented the teaching of the evolution of man  
 11. A person who wants extreme or complete political/social change  
 12. Movement that banned alcohol consumption and production in the early 1900's  
 15. Republican "America first and Return to Normalcy"  
 17. A new religious wave that believed in the literal truth of the bible  
 18. A person who is blamed for the wrongdoings, mistakes, or faults of others, especially for reasons of expediency  
 19. Cultural, social, and artistic explosion that impacted mostly African American culture

21. Nickname for the 1920's due to new types of music and entertainment  
 23. Over 500 foreign born citizens were deported in Nov. 1919 and Jan. 1920 during these raids  
 24. Young women who cut their hair short, wore short skirts and smoked and drank in public  
 25. Belief that native born White Americans are superior to everyone else  
 26. Restriction on the number of European immigrants - specifically immigrants and refugees from Eastern and Southern Europe  
 27. Science teacher that violated Tennessee's Butler Act and taught evolution in the schools  
 28. Founder of the Universal Negro Improvement Association and a leader of the Pan-Africanism movement
