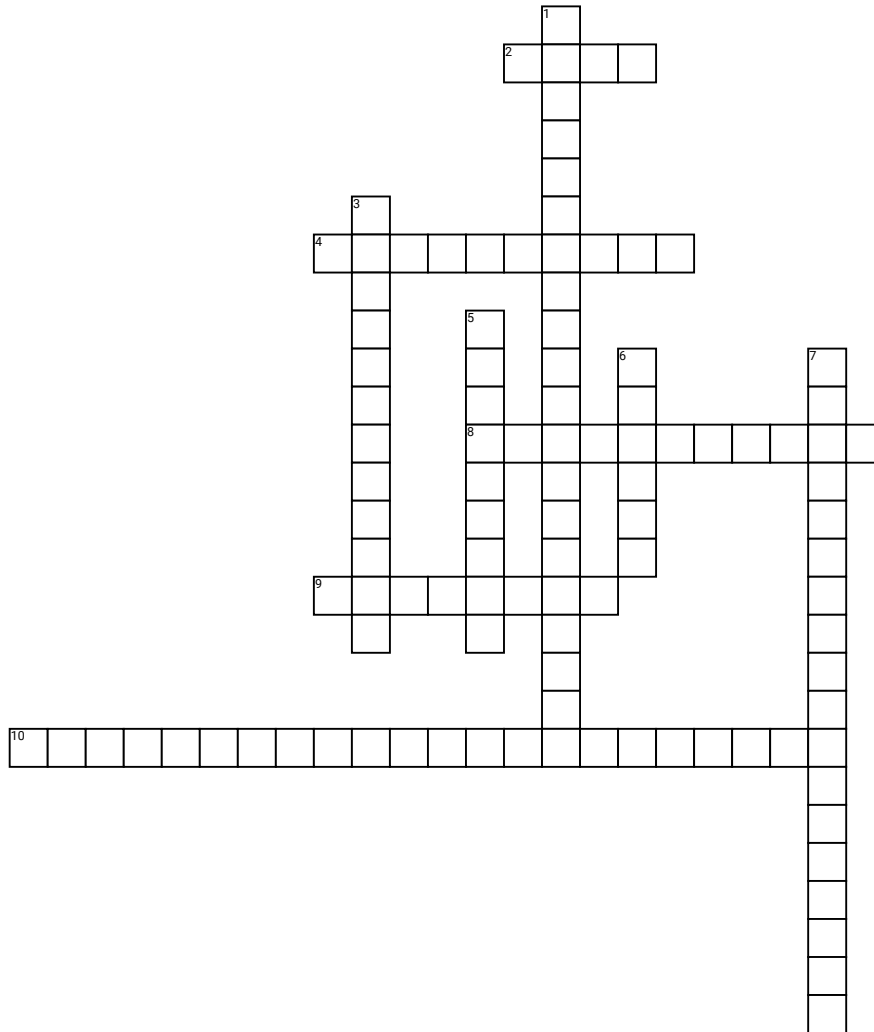


# The Yellow Wallpaper
