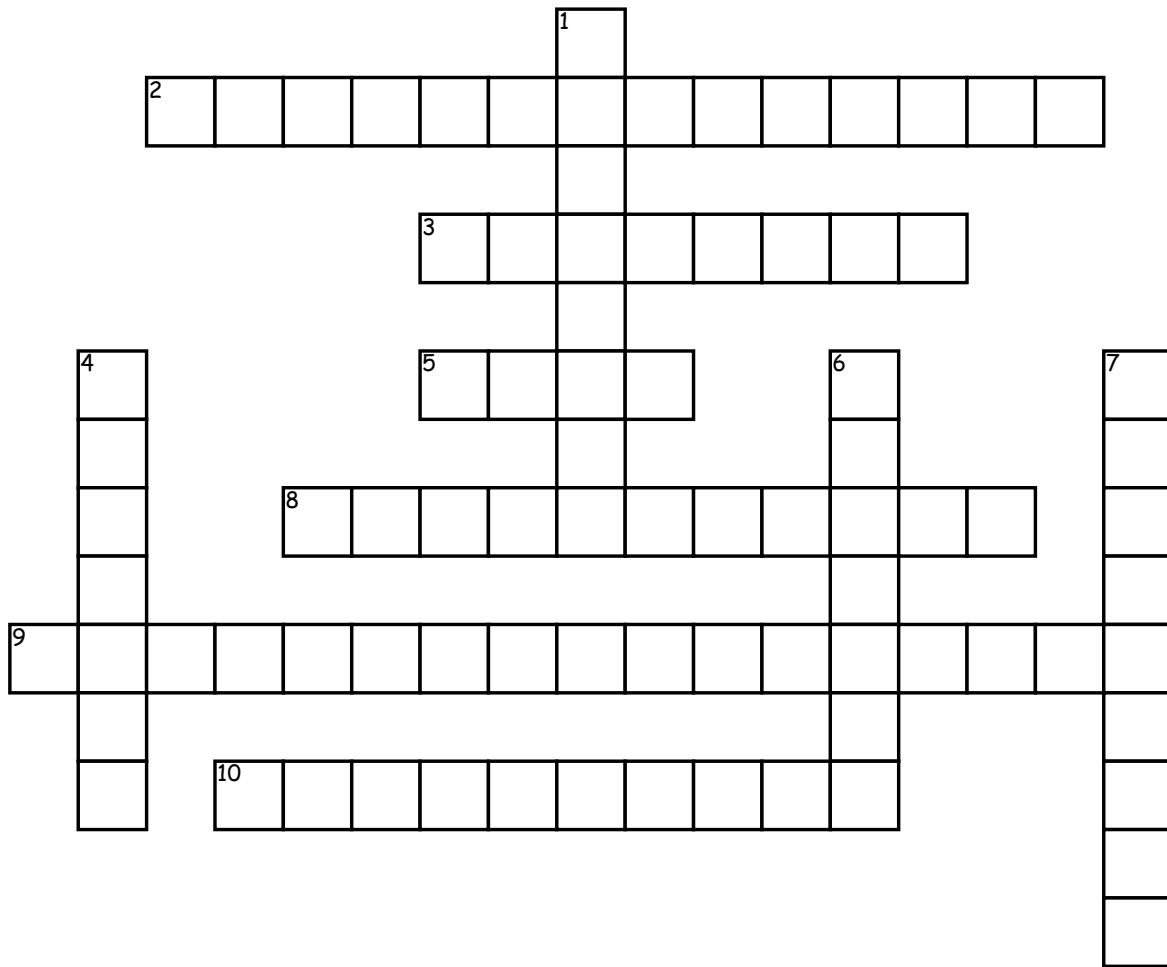

- 2. The act of interpreting; elucidation; explication
- 3. That which tends to prove or disprove something; ground for belief; proof
- 5. A particular tendency, trend, inclination, feeling, or opinion, especially one that is preconceived or unreasoned
- 8. A specified or stated manner of consideration or appraisal; standpoint
- 9. To put in a context, especially one that is characteristic or appropriate, as for purposes of study
- 10. The sequential order in which past events occur

- 1. A handmade object, as a tool, or the remains of one, as a shard of pottery, characteristic of an earlier time or cultural stage, especially such as an object found at an archaeological excavation
- 4. A continuous, systematic narrative of past events as relating to a particular people, country, period, person, etc., usually written as chronological account; chronicle
- 6. Pertaining to or being a firsthand account, original data, etc., based on direct knowledge
- 7. Pertaining to or being a derived or derivative account, an evaluation of original data, etc., not primary or original
