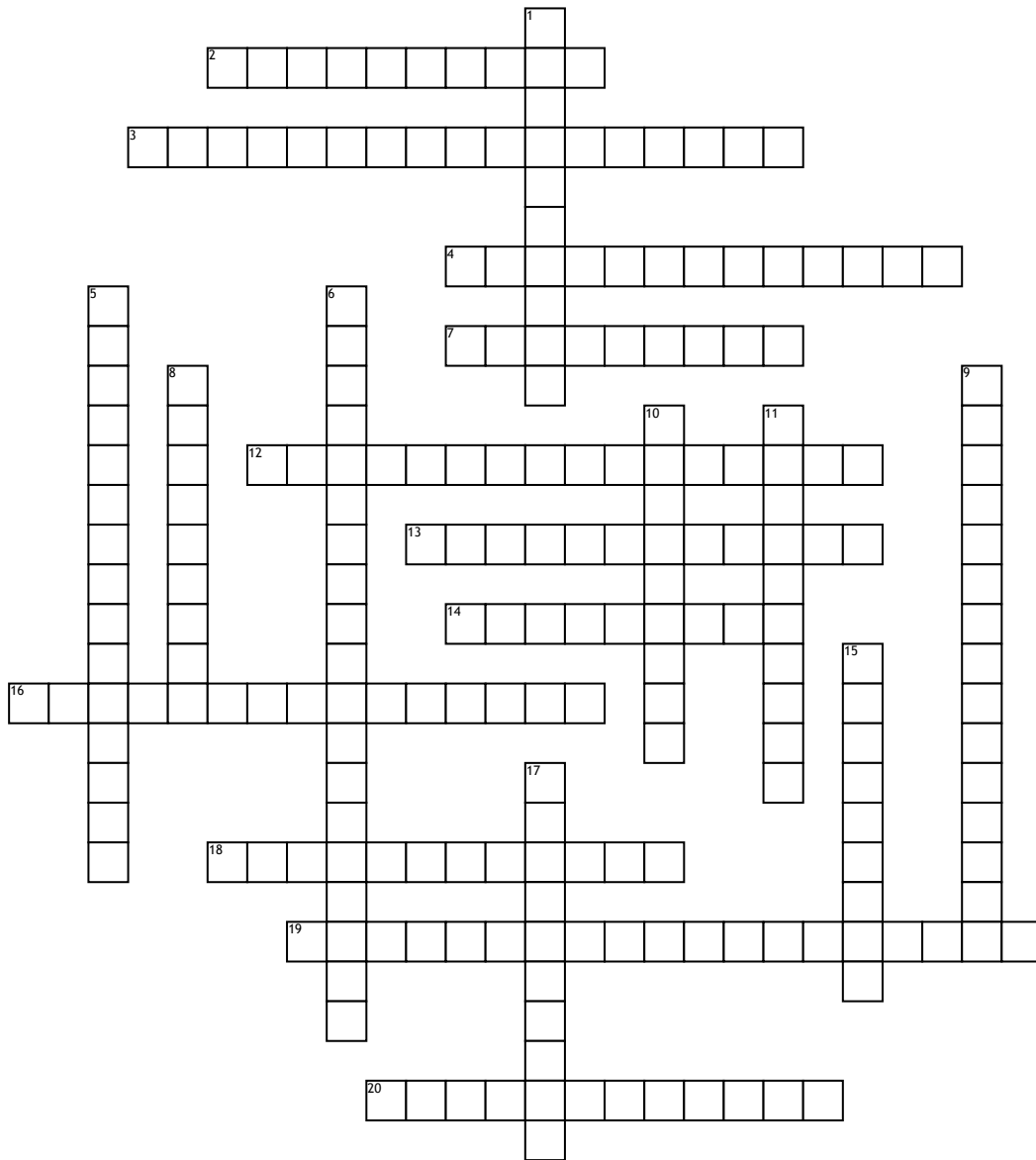


Tin Pan Alley

2. The most profitable product of Tin Pan Alley songwriters
 3. The line "Born on the Fourth of July" from this song, inspired the title for Ron Kovic's bestselling autobiography and film, starring Tom Cruise
 4. NYC building known as the center for the popular music industry
 7. Tin Pan Alley songwriter George M Cohan wrote this song, the most popular in WWI
 12. Debbie Reynolds and Carleton Carpenter recorded this song in 1950. It reached #3 on the Billboard Charts.
 13. Singers and piano players who demonstrated songs for the publishers of Tin Pan Alley
 14. This song is set in the fictitious, exotic "San Domingo"

16. This song led to a "rumba craze" in the US and Europe in the 1940s
 18. A popular preschool sing along song
 19. In 1966, the lyric of this song was anonymously rewritten to avoid controversy during the Civil Rights era
 20. This composer/lyricist could not read music, was once nicknamed the "King of Tin Pan Alley", composed over 1500 songs and lived to 101

1. Song written about a regular customer at a saloon in Jackson, Michigan who kept rather "irregular" hours. Composer died of cirrhosis at age 35.s
 5. The first song in film to be sung by an interracial ensemble
 6. One of Groucho Marx's signature tunes

8. "Button Up Your Overcoat" was most famously recorded by this artist, whose voice was later the inspiration for "Betty Boop"
 9. The composer arranged for all royalties from this song to be given to the Boy and Girl Scouts of NY
 10. Broadway musical about the life and early career of Carole King
 11. This composer of "Friendship" was born in Peru, IN, graduated from Yale and attended Harvard Law
 15. Song about a couple who can't afford a honeymoon in Niagara, instead taking in the cheapest sights in NY
 17. The most successful female songwriter in the 2nd half of the 20th century
