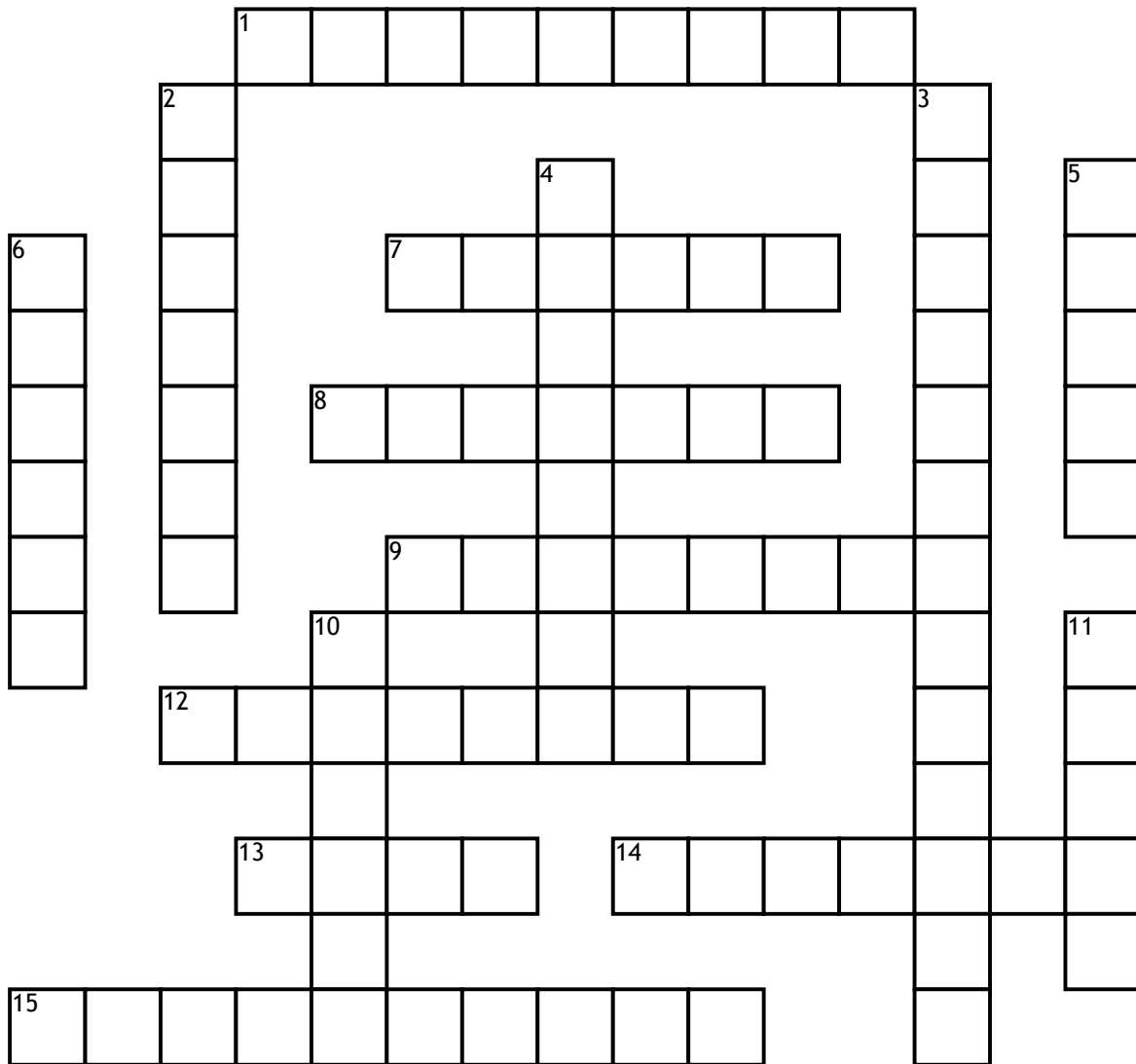


Toni Morrison Nobel Prize Crossword Puzzle
