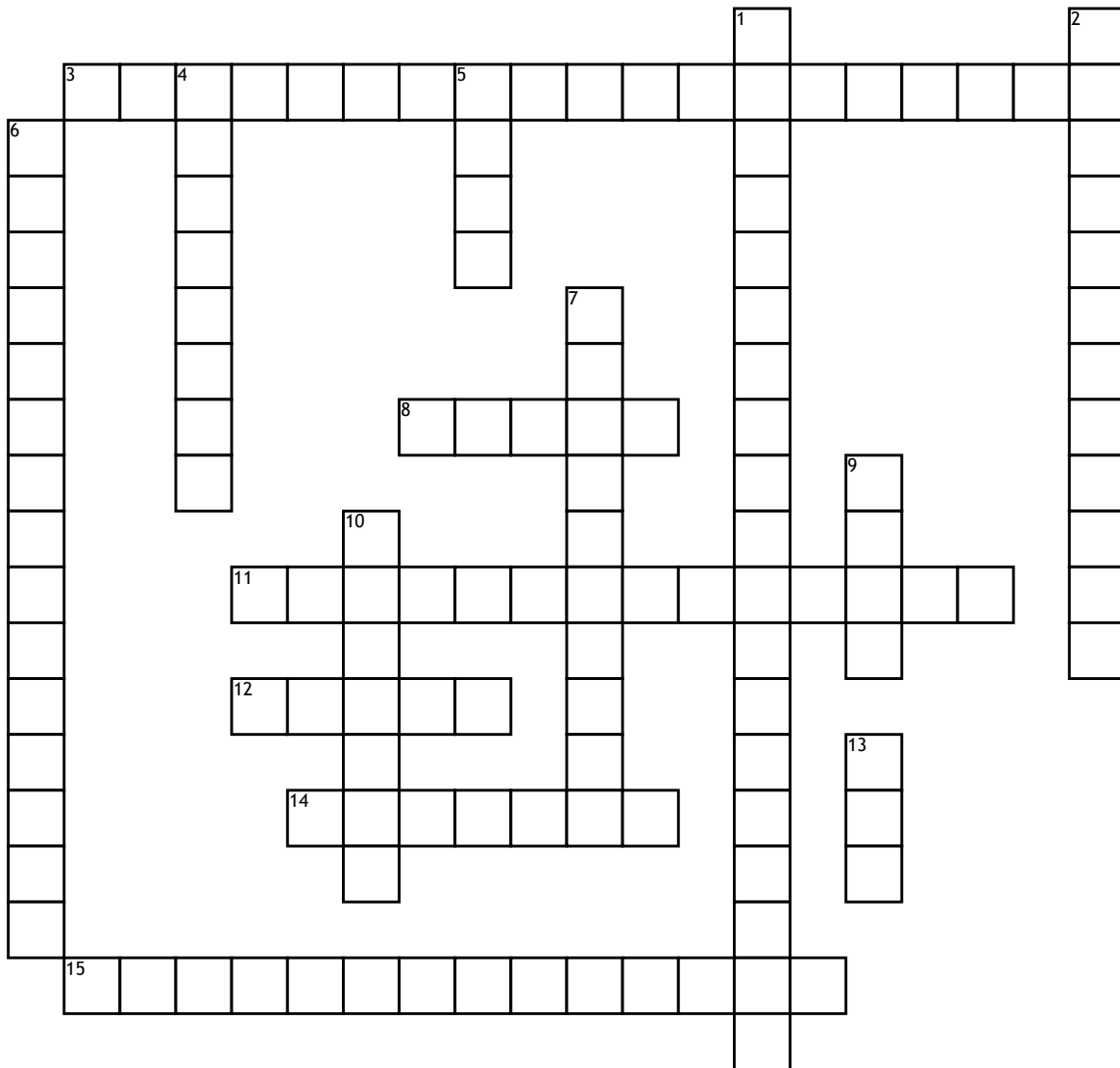


# Transfusion Reactions



**Across**

- 3. An adverse response to a blood or blood product transfusion.
- 8. Sharp or severe in effect; intense
- 11. Nursing staff responsibility
- 12. Acute lung injury within 6 hours of transfusion.
- 14. Marked or caused by fever

- 15. Fever, chills, back pain, hemoglobinemia, hemoglobinuria, bleeding, DIC, onset within 24 hours of transfusion.

**Down**

- 1. Only symptoms are fever and chills within 24 hours of transfusion.
- 2. Severe hypotension very early in transfusion
- 4. Free from fever; not marked by fever

- 5. First step when reaction is suspected.
- 6. Fever, anemia at least 1 week after transfusion.
- 7. Localized hives/redness
- 9. Dyspnea, hypoxia during or after transfusion.
- 10. Typically secondary to antibodies associated with the Rh and Kidd systems.
- 13. First test performed by lab staff.
