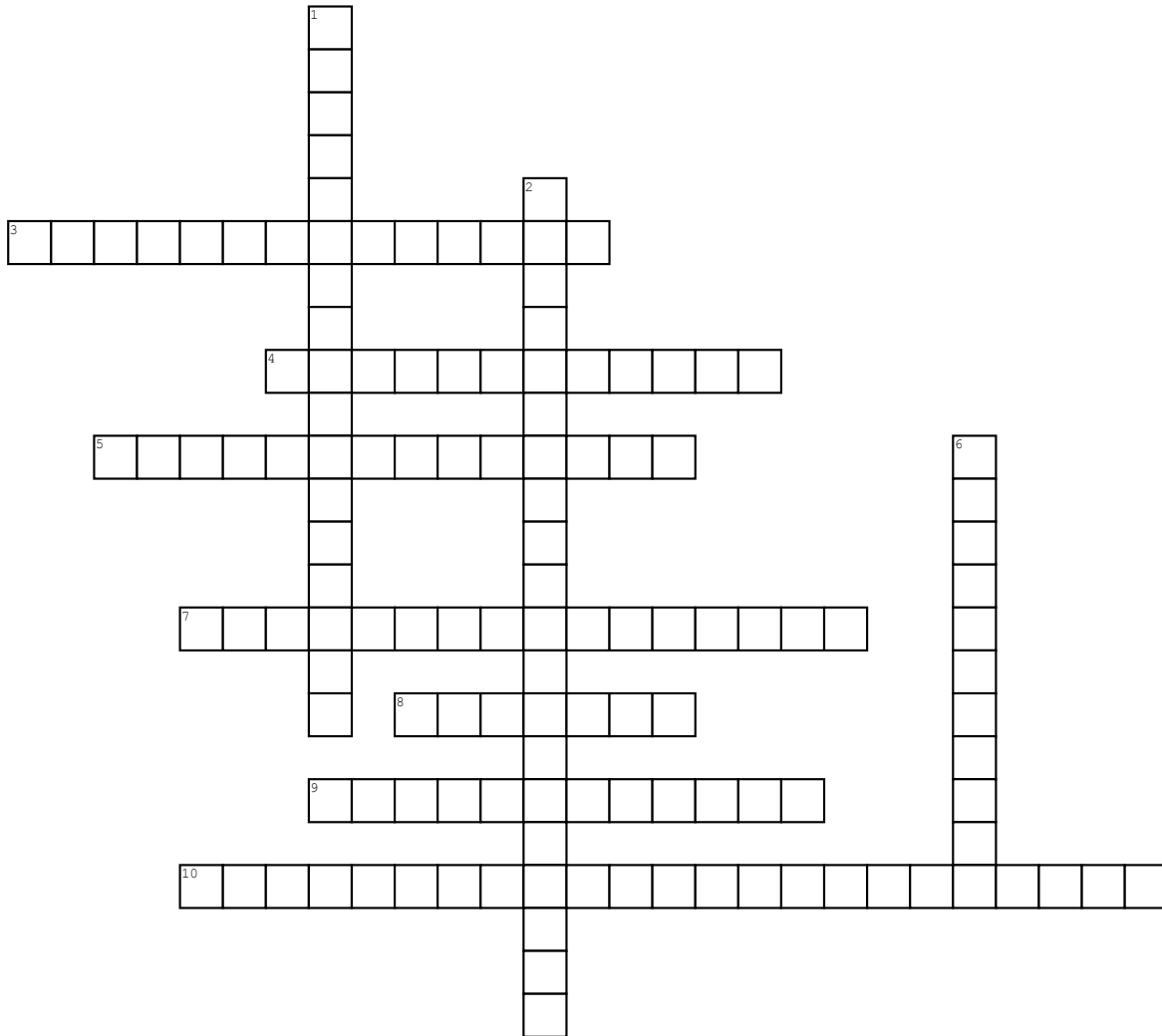


True Crimes: Computer Forensics
