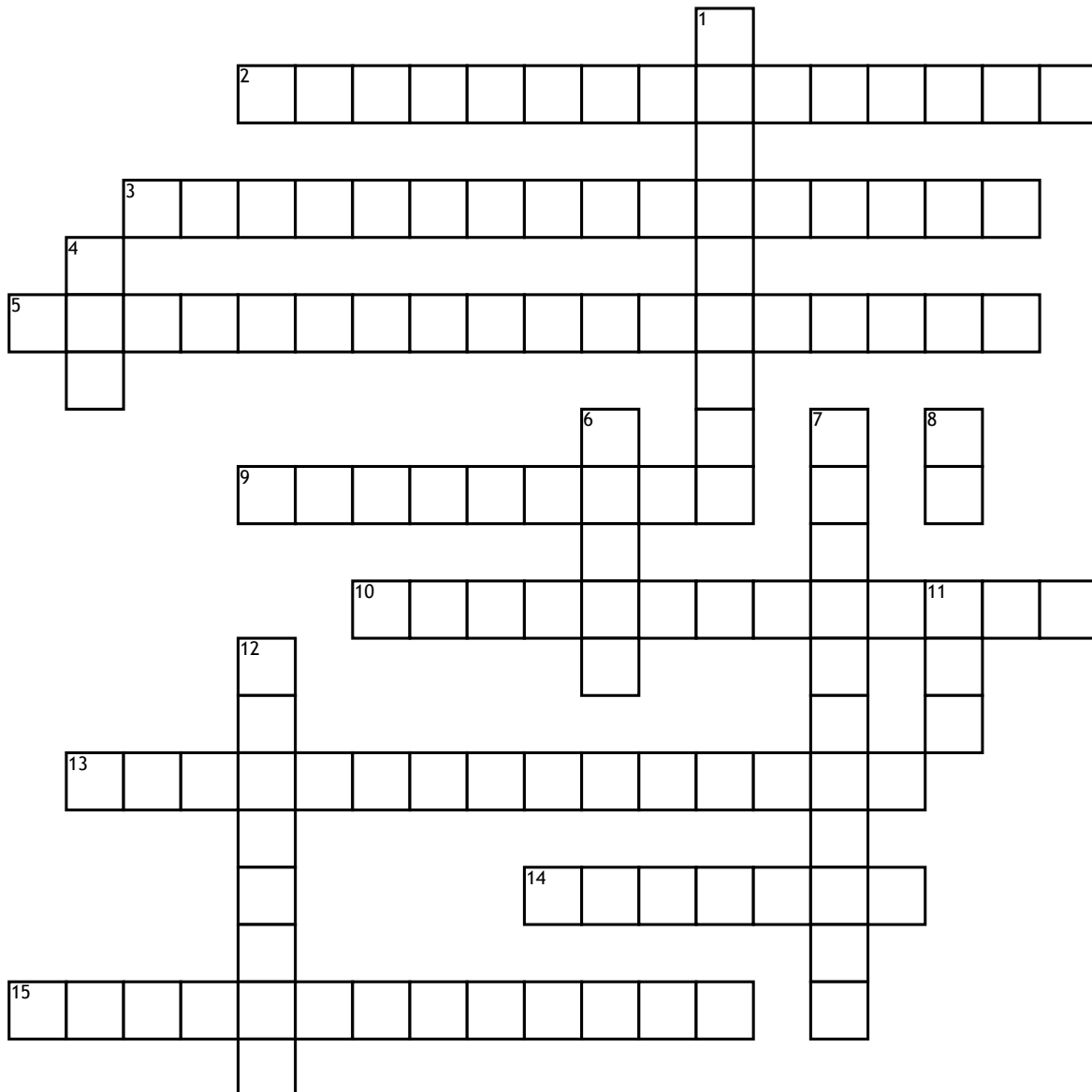


Types of government in New Zealand
