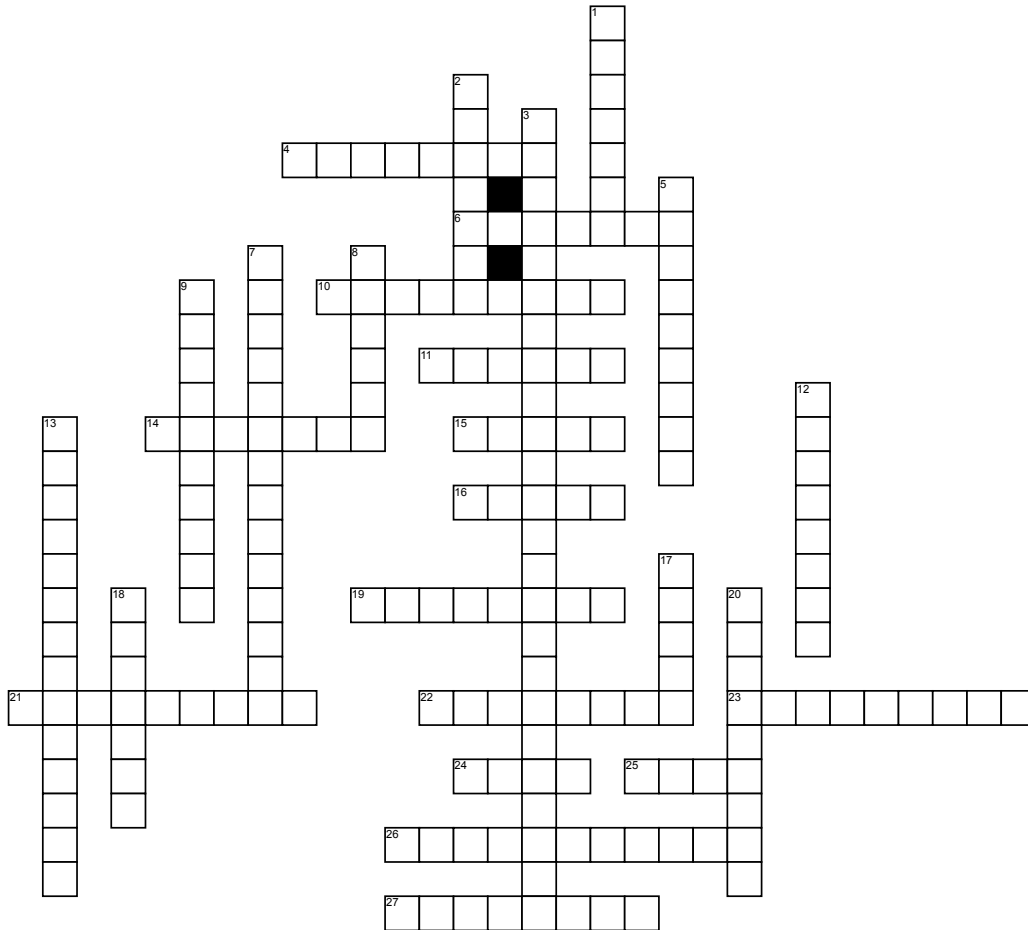


Vintage Spirit Crossword
