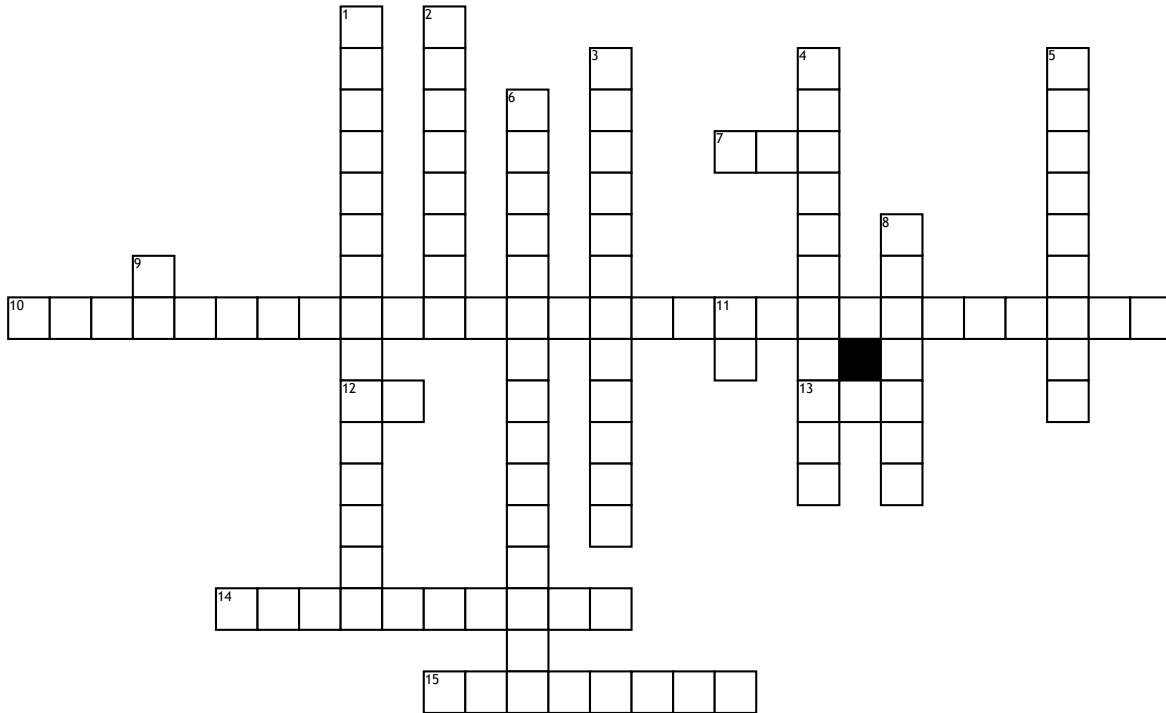

7. AKA "Air-Puff" machine. A diagnostic tool used by eye care professionals to measure the intraocular pressure (IOP) in a patient's eye.
10. Procedure eye care professionals perform to determine the intraocular pressure (IOP).
12. Abbreviation for oculus sinister. Left Eye.
13. The fluid pressure inside the eye
14. The bending of a wave when it enters a medium where its speed is different.
15. A technical practitioner who designs, fits, and dispenses corrective lenses to correct a person's vision.

1. A diagnostic instrument used for measuring the curvature of anterior (nearer the front) surface of the cornea.
2. A lamp that emits a narrow but intense beam of light, used for examining the interior of the eye.
3. Sharpness of vision, measured by the ability to discern letters or numbers at a given distance according to a fixed standard
4. (Doctor of Optometry, OD) A health care professional who examines eyes for visual defects and abnormalities.

5. An instrument used to test individual lenses on each eye during an exam.
6. (M.D) A specialist in the branch of medicine related to the study and treatment of disorders and diseases of the eye.
8. Handheld instrument that provides IOP readings that correlate closely with Goldmann Applanation.
9. Abbreviation for oculus dexter. Right Eye.
11. Abbreviation for oculus utro. Both Eyes.
