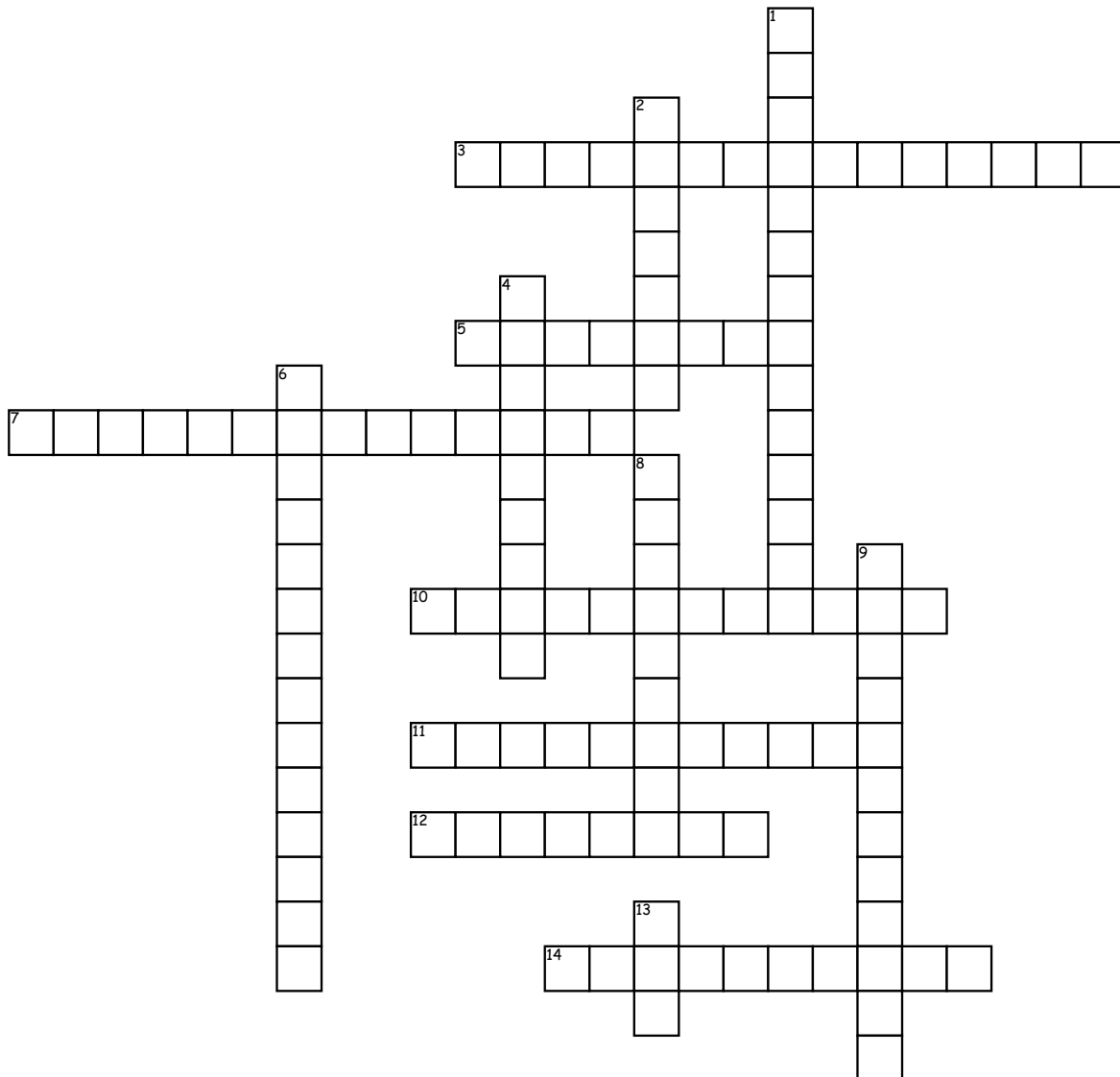

**7.** Two-round system, a voting system used to elect a single winner, whereby only two candidates from the first round continue to the second round

**11.** Free from outside control ; not depending on another's authority

**12.** An official list or record, for example of births, marriages, and deaths, of shipping, or of historic places

**14.** Information, especially of a biased or misleading nature, used to promote or publicize a particular political cause or point of view
