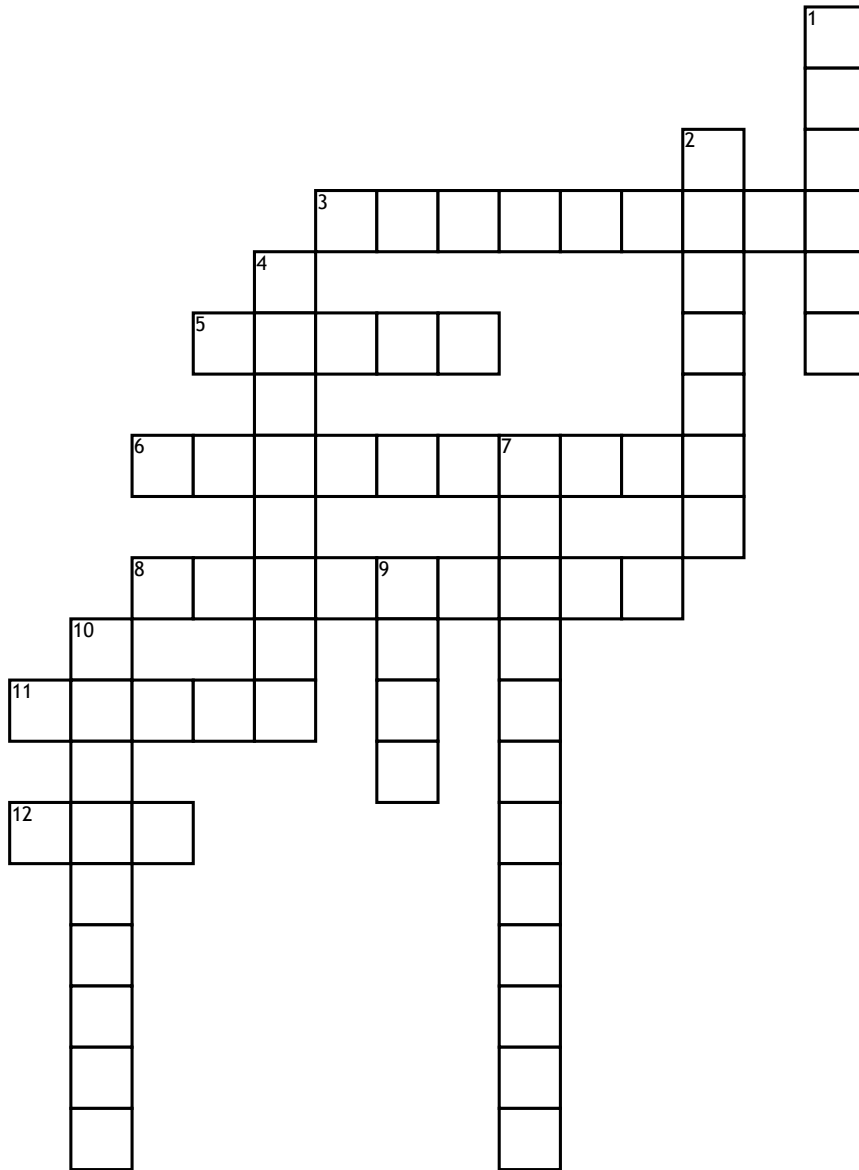


# Vowels and Consonant Terminology
