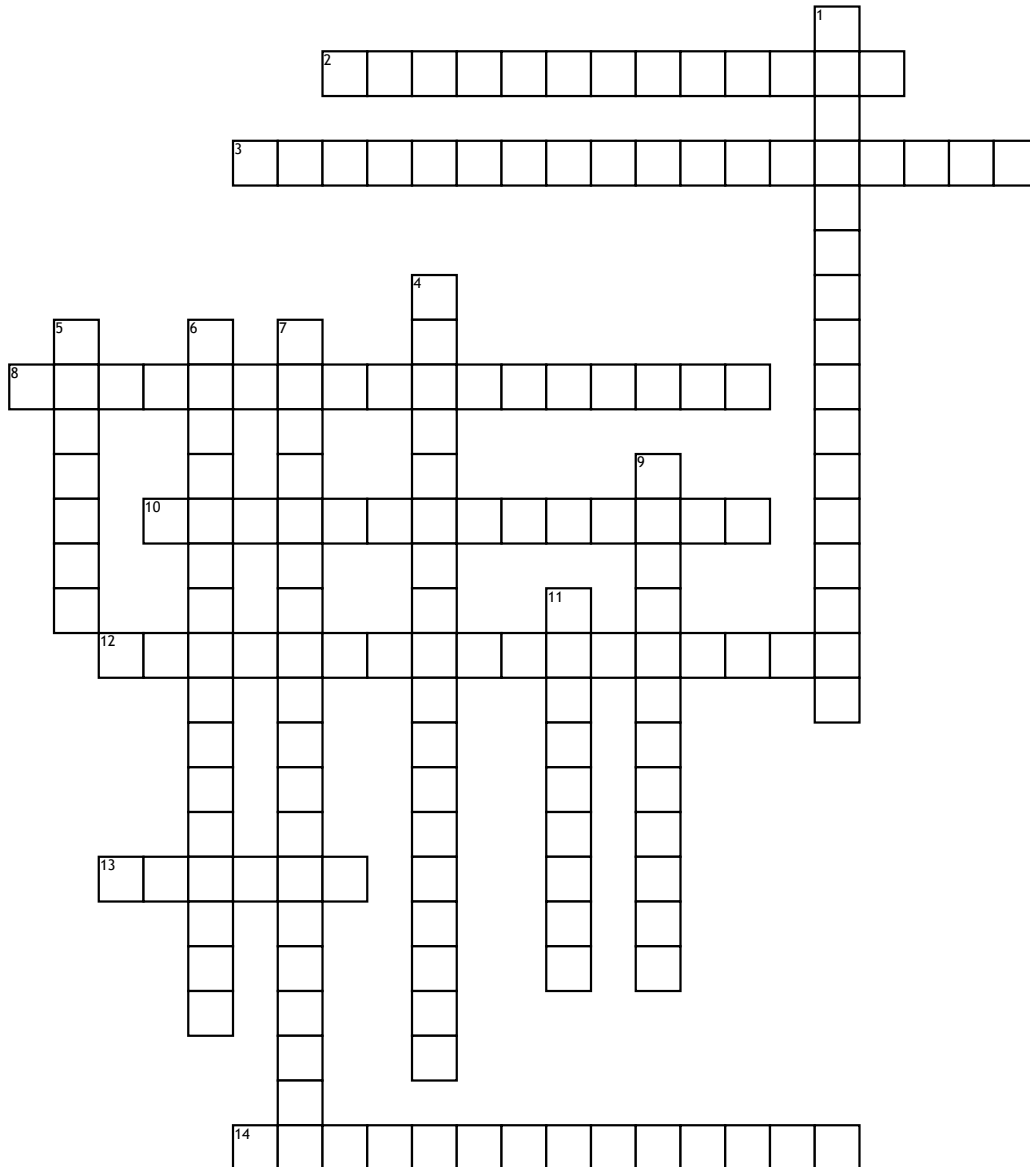


Vulnerable Populations
