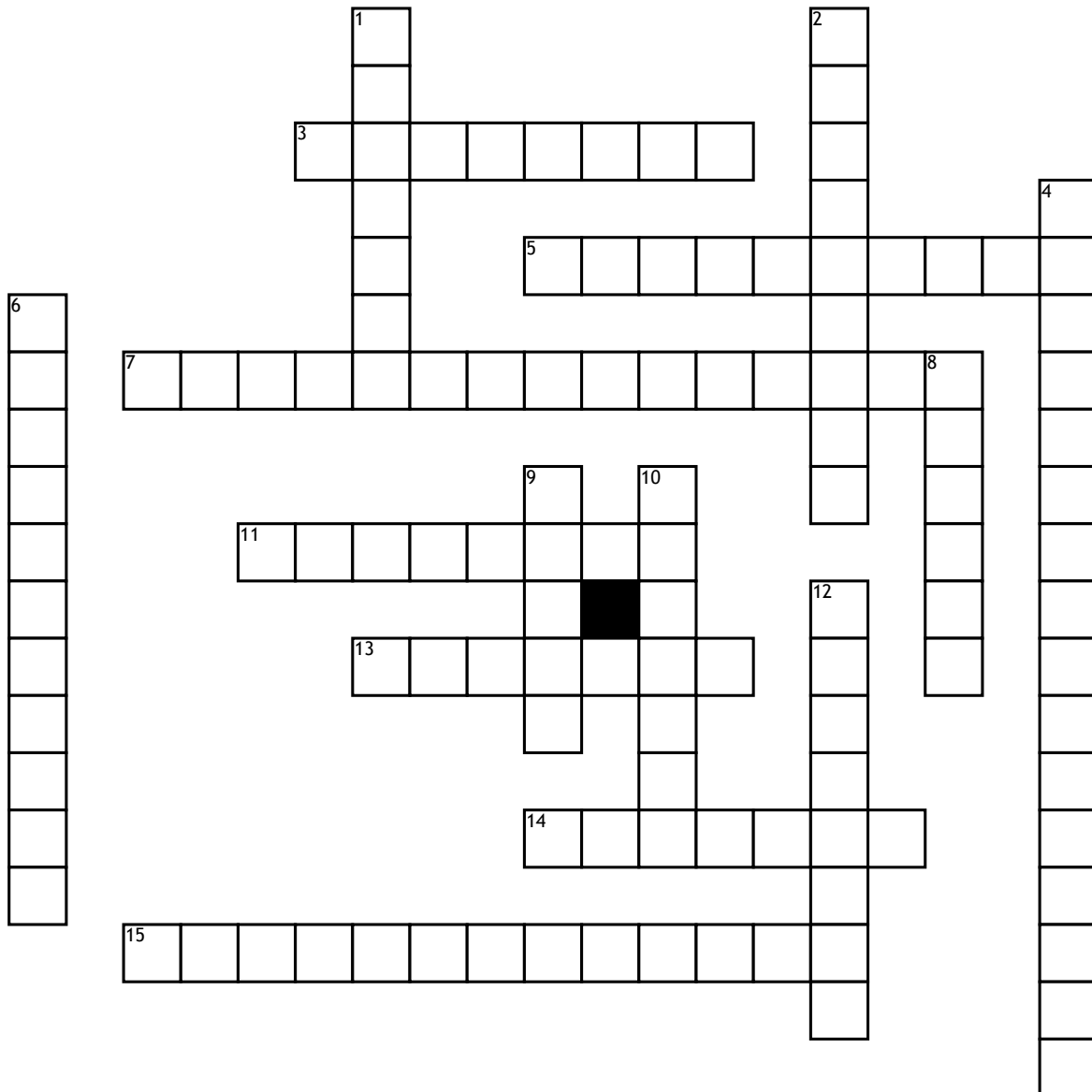

- 3. a quantity representing the amount of water vapor in the atmosphere or in a gas.
- 5. is a region of the world where there is little precipitation and the air is very dry
- 7. classification is a non-arid climate in which all twelve months have mean temperatures of warmer than 18 °C.

- 1. a long high sea wave caused by an earthquake, submarine landslide, or other disturbance.
- 2. a storm with a violent wind, in particular a tropical cyclone in the Caribbean.
- 4. the temperate or tepid climates of Earth occur in the middle latitudes, which span between the tropics and the polar regions of Earth.
- 6. characterized by COLD TEMPERATURE for a majority of the time during the year.

- 8. an irregularly occurring and complex series of climatic changes affecting the equatorial Pacific region and beyond every few years, characterized by the appearance of unusually warm, nutrient-poor water off northern Peru and Ecuador, typically in late December.
- 9. a large naturally occurring community of flora and fauna occupying a major habitat, e.g. forest or tundra.
- 10. the state of the atmosphere at a place and time as regards heat, dryness, sunshine, wind, rain, etc.
- 12. the covering or submerging of normally dry land with a large amount of water.
