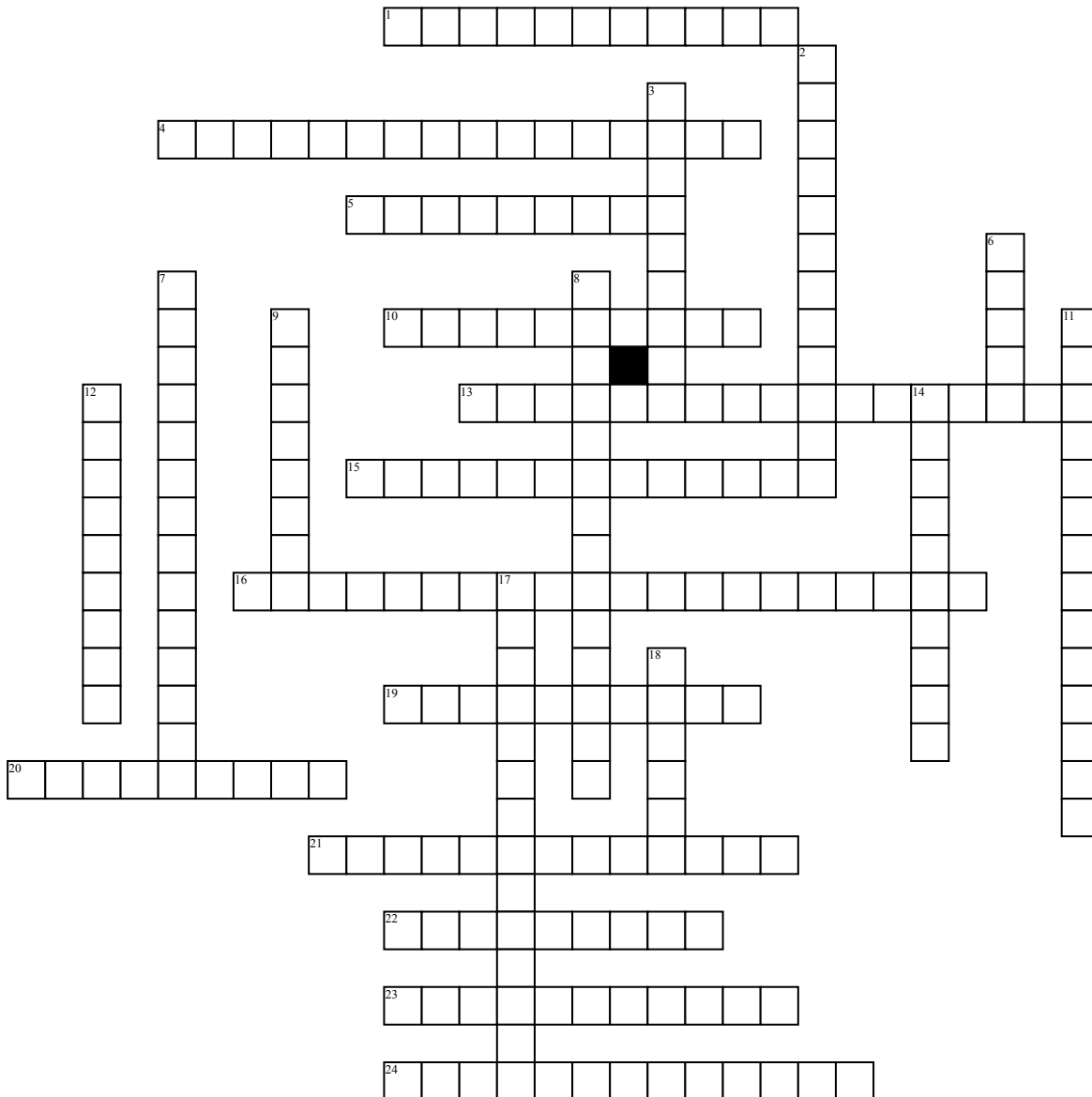

5. A campaign of the First World War that took place in the Ottoman Empire between 25 April 1915 and 9 January 1916.
10. The idea of a political union of all the slavic peoples
13. A French politician, physician, and journalist who was Prime Minister of France during the First World War.

16. A peace treaty signed on March 3, 1918, between the new Bolshevik government of Soviet Russia and the Central Powers that ended Russia's participation in World War I.
