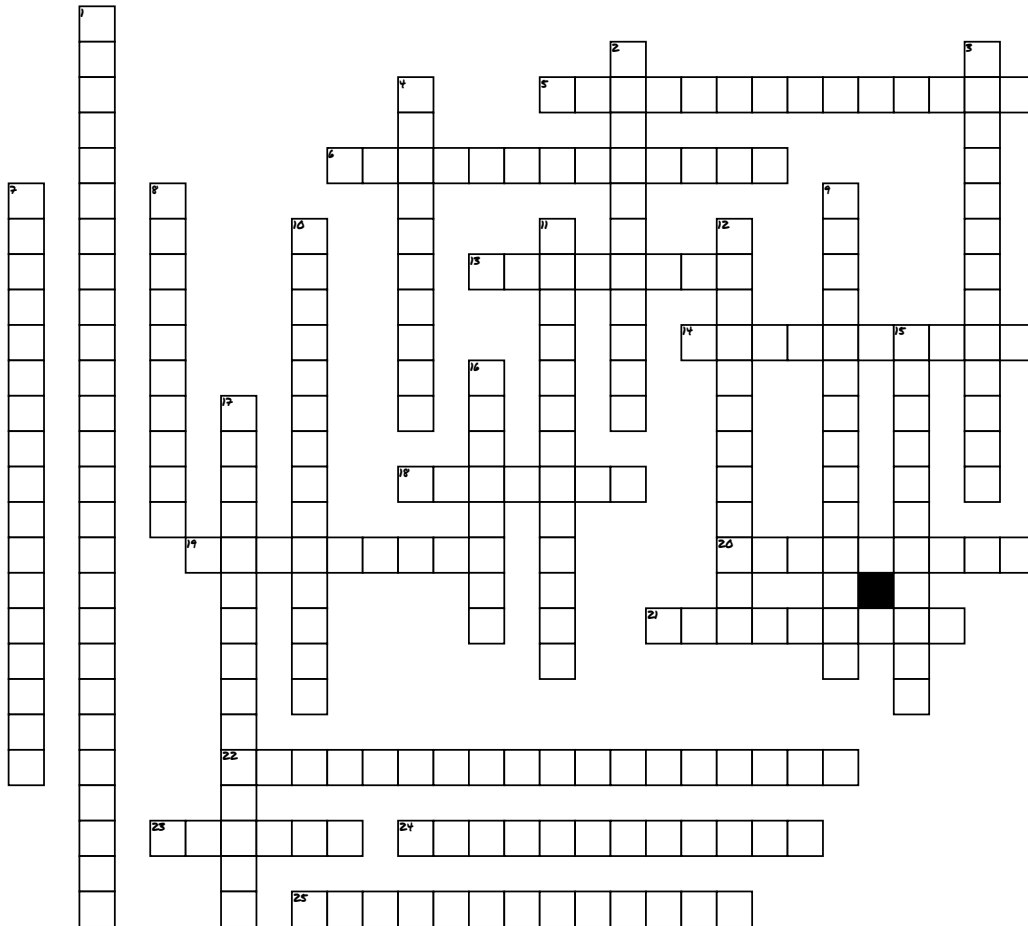

- 5. MOVEMENT BETWEEN 1915 - 1940 OF MILLIONS OF AFRICAN AMERICANS TO THE NORTH IN SEARCH OF WORK AND FAIR TREATMENT.
- 6. 28TH PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES
- 13. CERTIFICATES SOLD BY THE UNITED STATES GOVERNMENT TO PAY FOR THE WAR.
- 14. WERE CRIMINALS WHO SMUGGLED ILLEGAL ALCOHOL, ESPECIALLY DURING AMERICAN PROHIBITION AND OTHER TIMES AND PLACES WHERE ALCOHOL WAS AND IS ILLEGAL.
- 18. A MASKLIKE DEVICE CONTAINING OR ATTACHED TO A COMPONENT THAT FILTERS THE AIR INHALED BY THE WEARER THROUGH CHARCOAL AND CHEMICALS, FOR PROTECTING THE FACE AND LUNGS AGAINST NOXIOUS GASES AND FUMES, AS IN WARFARE OR IN CERTAIN INDUSTRIAL PROCESSES.

- 10. GERMANY, AUSTRIA-HUNGARY, ITALY
- 11. FIGHTING WITH TRENCHES, MINES, AND BARBED WIRE. HORRIBLE LIVING CONDITIONS, GREAT SLAUGHTER, NO GAINS, STALEMATE, USED IN WWI.
- 12. 1917 LAW THAT SET HEAVY FINES AND LONG PRISON TERMS FOR ANTIWAR ACTIVITIES
- 15. AS PART OF THE TREATY OF VERSAILLES, GERMANY WAS ORDERED TO PAY FINES TO THE ALLIES TO REPAY THE COSTS OF THE WAR. OPPOSED BY THE U.S., IT QUICKLY LEAD TO A SEVERE DEPRESSION IN GERMANY.
- 16. STARTED IN 1919 - INTENSE FEAR OF COMMUNISM AND OTHER POLITICALLY RADICAL IDEAS.
- 17. FORMED IN 1920. AN ORGANIZATION OF NATIONS FORMED AFTER WORLD WAR I TO PROMOTE COOPERATION AND PEACE.
