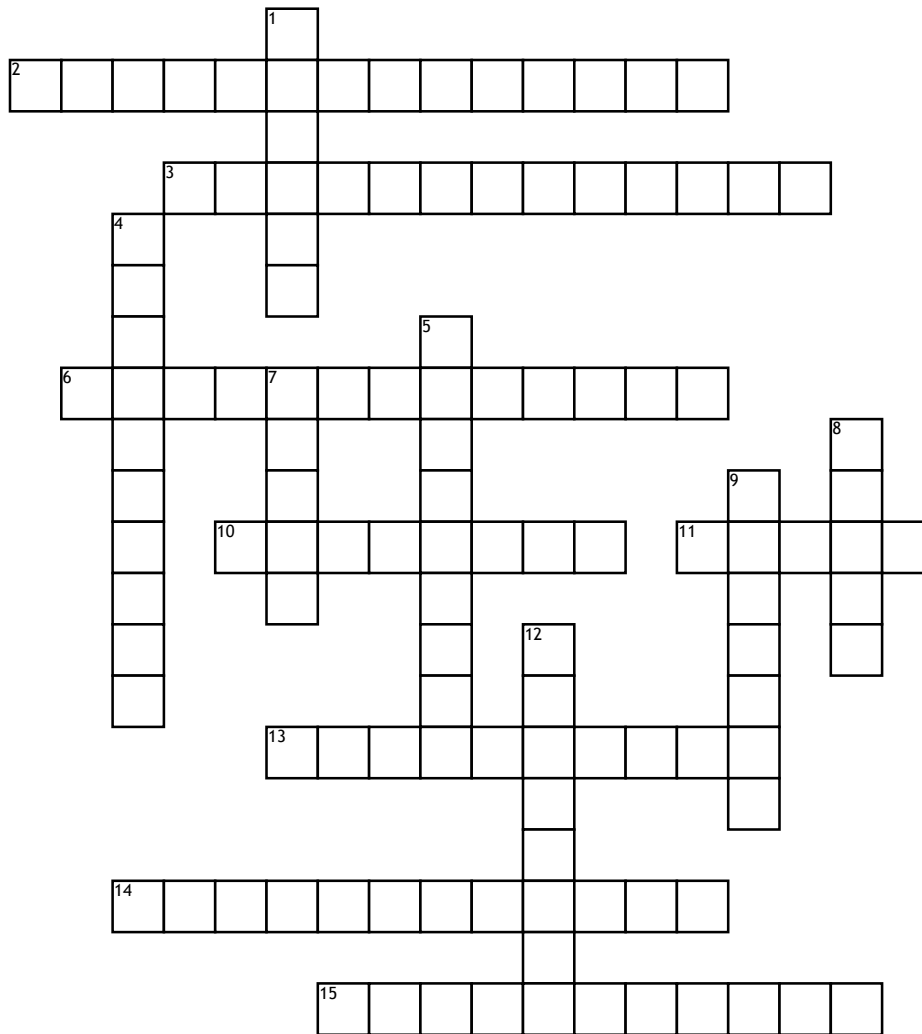


# WW1 Crossword Puzzle
